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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 25-38-204 is	amended to read as follows:
24	25-38-204. Type 1 transfers of various agricultural agencies.	
25	The following departments, institutions, other agencies, or parts	
26	thereof, are transferred to the Arkansas Agriculture Department by a type l	
27	transfer, as provided for in § 25-2-104, under which the departments,	
28	institutions, other agencies, or parts thereof, shall be administered under	
29	the direction and supervision of that principal department, but shall retain	
30	the same prescribed statutory powers, authorities, duties, and functions as	
31	they had before the transfer:	
32	(1) Abandoned Pesticide Advisory B	oard, created under § 8-7-

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5	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
6	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Constitution of the State	
7	of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year	
8	period; that the effectiveness of this act on July 1, 2007, is essential to	
9	the operations of the Arkansas Development Finance Authority and the Arkansas	
10	Agriculture Department both of whose fiscal years begin on July 1, and that	
11	in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the	
12	effective date of this act beyond July 1, 2007, could work irreparable harm	
13	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental	
14	programs. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being	
15	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall	
16	become effective on:	
17	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;	
18	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,	
19	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the	
20	bill; or	
21	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is	
22	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.	
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
