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35	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
36	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that because of issues and		

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1	widespread problems that have arisen with the current composition and		
2	requirements of the State Board of Cosmetology, this act changes the		
3	composition and requirements of the board; that the public has spoken clearly		
4	on these needed changes; and that this act is necessary because deficiencies		
5	in the cosmetology industry require immediate redress. Therefore, an		
6	emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the		
7	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
8	<u>on:</u>		
9	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
10	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
11	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
12	<u>bill; or</u>
