- 3 (i) Sundays; or
- 4 <u>(ii)</u> state State or county holidays.
- 5 (2) However, on all other elections, including, but not limited 6 to, general primary and general runoff elections, early voting shall be 7 available to any qualified elector who applies to the county clerk during 8 regular office hours, beginning fifteen (15) days before an election and 9 ending on the <u>fourth</u> day before the election day at the time the county
- 10 clerk's office regularly closes.
- 11 (b)(1)(A) The county board of election commissioners may decide to
  12 hold early voting at additional polling sites outside the offices of the
  13 county clerk and to include the additional voting locations for a maximum of
