AN ACT TO AMEND THE APPROPRIATION ENACTED BY ACT
480 OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF 2005 AND TO CLARIFY
SECTION 3 OF ACT 2315 OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF
2005 REGARDING THE LAKE VILLAGE FIRE DEPARTMENT.

Subtitle

AN ACT TO AMEND THE APPROPRIATION
ENACTED BY ACT 480 OF THE REGULAR
SESSION OF 2005 AND TO CLARIFY SECTION 3
OF ACT 2315 OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF
2005 REGARDING THE LAKE VILLAGE FIRE
DEPARTMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Uncodified Section 1(G) of Act 480 of 2005 is amended to
read as follows:

(G) For state assistance to the Lake Village ~~Rural~~ Fire Department, the
sum of\$15,000.

SECTION 2. As referenced in Section 3 of Act 2315 of the Regular
Session, 85th General Assembly, which identifies the Lake Village Rural Fire
Department as a project to be funded from the 85th Session Projects Account of
the General Improvement Fund, shall instead be deemed to be the Lake Village
Fire Department.

SECTION 3. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor



1 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects
2 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available
3 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and
4 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and
5 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or
6 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State
7 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects
8 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds
9 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General
10 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall
11 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

12 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State
13 Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the
14 Revenue Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of
15 this State and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
16 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
17 disbursement of any funds provided by this act unless specifically provided
18 otherwise by law.

20 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
21 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
22 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
23 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
24 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
25 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
26 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
27 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

29 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
30 General Assembly that the Lake Village Fire Department was not included in
31 the General Improvement Distribution Act of 2005; that funds had been set
32 aside for this project but the project had been inadvertently identified as
33 the Lake Village Rural Fire Department; that to provide funding for the
34 appropriation for the Lake Village Fire Department authorized by Section 1 of
35 Act 480 of 2005, the passage of this Act is necessary. Therefore, an
36 emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for

1 the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
2 effective on:

3 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

4 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
5 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
6 bill; or

7 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
8 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
