Employees assigned to these classifications may be eligible for hazardous 18 19 duty pay if the Director of the Department of Correction certifies to the 20 Chief Fiscal Officer that employees in these positions have been assigned 21 direct supervision of inmates which requires these positions to be exposed to 22 increased risk of personal injury.

23 Employees in the above classifications who are assigned to Maximum Security 24 lockup areas, i.e. administrative, segregation, punitive isolation and death 25 row at the maximum security unit, Varner Unit, Cummins Unit, and East 26 Arkansas Regional Unit, are authorized to receive the hazardous duty pay 27 allowance and an additional amount of maximum security incentive pay to five 28 and one-half percent of the annual salary authorized by law. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 24 25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 26 EDUCATIONAL INCENTIVE BONUS PAYMENT - In recognition of the value of higher education, the Arkansas Department of Correction is authorized to issue one-27 28 time monetary bonus payments to employees who, while serving in a position 29 with the Arkansas Department of Correction, earn a degree or professional 30 license over and above that required by the Office of Personnel Management as qualifications for the position. In addition, the degree earned must be 31 32 related to the functions of the position (such as a Correctional Officer II 33 earning a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice, as opposed to a Correctional 34 Officer II earning a Bachelor's Degree in Mathematics). Bonuses will be paid 35 at the following rates: 36 Associate Degree \$1,000

- 1 Bachelor's Degree \$1,500
- 2 <u>Master's Degree</u> \$2,500
- 3 <u>Doctoral Degree</u> \$3,500
- 4 <u>Professional License</u> \$1,250
- 5 Generally a professional license would only qualify for a bonus if it
- 6 permitted the individual to carry out his/her profession in the Arkansas
- 7 Department of Correction at a higher level e.g., psychologist,

8 psychological examiner, journeyman plumber, licensed social worker, etc.

- 9 The amounts received under the provisions of this section shall not be
- 10 considered as exceeding the maximum authorized annual salary allowance for
- 11 employees in receipt of such amounts. Such amounts shall be considered
- 12 Regular Salary, and the Director of the Department of Correction shall adopt
- 13 necessary rules and regulations for administration of this provision. Such

SECTION 44. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 20 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. NEW OR 22 ADDITIONAL POSITIONS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the 23 State shall determine the amount of general revenue authorized by the 86th 24 General Assembly to be distributed to the Department of Correction Inmate Care 25 and Custody Fund Account to fund additional Regular Salary positions and 26 Personal Services Matching costs each fiscal year of the 2007-09 biennium over 27 and above the amount of general revenue the Department of Correction budgeted 28 for Regular Salaries and Personal Services Matching costs during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall cause 29 30 the amount of general revenue so determined each fiscal year to be set aside within the Department of Correction Inmate Care and Custody Fund Account, and 31 32 that the amount determined, or any portion thereof, shall not be budgeted or 33 committed for expenditure by the Department of Correction without prior 34 approval from the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. From 35 time to time, the Department of Correction may request approval of the Chief

LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 19 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 20 21 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 22 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 23 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 24 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 25 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 26 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 27 28 SECTION 48. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 29 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 30 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of 31 32 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 33 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the 34 35 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 36
