26	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-82-503(a), regarding entitlement to

28	disability, is amended to read as follows:			
29	(a) If any Arkansas law enforcement officer, full-time or volunteer

total of eight (8) semesters, or the equivalent thereof, of scholarship awards without cost, exclusive of books, food, school supplies, materials, and dues or fees for extracurricular activities, at any state-supported college, university, or technical institute of his or her choice within this state. Up to four (4) semesters, or the equivalent thereof, may be taken at a *technical institute*.

8 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 9 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that confusion exists regarding the law and that people are being denied scholarships under Arkansas Code § 6-82-10 11 503 because the public service employee was returning from a location where a hazardous situation existed; that the risks that public service employees 12 13 take in the scope of going to and returning from hazardous situations are equally high; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure that 14 15 public service employees who risk their lives and health are treated equally. 16 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for 17 the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on: 18 19 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; 20 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the 21 bil<u>l; or</u> 22 23 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 24 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto. 25 26 /s/ Wood 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34
