24	The General Asse	embly declares this act to be in c	oncordance with the

30	SECTION 2. Arka	ansas Code § 6-15-426(e)-(f), conc	erning school

32	(e) Any Each public school or school district classified as in school

2	(f) The comprehensive school improvement plan shall strategies

6	(1) Be based on an analysis of student performance data and		
7	other relevant data that provides a plan of action to address deficiencies in		
8	student performance and any academic achievement gap evidenced in the

28	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
29	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that in order to ensure an adequate		
30	education for all Arkansas public school students, public schools or school		
31	districts should be required to file detailed school improvement plans with		
32	the Department of Education, and the Department of Education should monitor		
33	compliance with those plans; and that this act is immediately necessary		
34	because the determination of educational strategies and the use of public		
35	funds to develop and implement school improvement plans depends on early		
36	planning by public school districts: that if these plans are not developed by		

1	July 1, 2007, public school students in those schools and school districts				
2	will not benefit from the proper implementation of the plans. Therefore, as				
3	emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for				
4	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become				
5	effective on:				
6	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;				
7	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,				
8	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the				
9	<pre>bill; or</pre>				
10	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is				
11	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
