9 AN ACT TO IMPROVE THE COLLEGE REMEDIATION RATE
10 AND ENSURE A GENERAL, SUITABLE, AND EFFICIENT
11 SYSTEM OF COLLEGE AND WORKFORCE READINESS FOR ALL
12 STUDENTS; TO SUPPORT VOLUNTARY STATEWIDE ACT
13 ASSESSMENT FOR ALL 11TH GRADE STUDENTS; TO
14 ENCOURAGE GREATER PARTICPATION IN THE SMART CORE
15 CURRICULUM; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

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25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

27 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 18 is amended to add an
28 additional subchapter to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER 16 – VOLUNTARY UNIVERSAL ACT ASSESMENT PROGRAM ACT

6-18-1601. Title.

31 This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Voluntary
32 Universal ACT Assessment Program Act".
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6-18-1602. Definitions.

35 As used in this subchapter:
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1 (1) "ACT Assessment" means a test of student educational
2 development that measures student readiness for future learning and that may
3 be used by institutions of higher education as part of their admissions,
4 placement, and scholarship processes and high schools to improve college and
5 workforce readiness; and

6 (2) "Smart Core" means the required curriculum that is part of
7 Next Step, a state initiative focused on improving Arkansas public schools
8 for all students so they are prepared for life beyond graduation.

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10 6-18-1603. Creation.

11 There is created in the Department of Education the Voluntary Universal
12 ACT Assessment Program to be developed, implemented, and administered by the
13 Department of Education as provided in this subchapter.

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15 6-18-1604. Purpose.

16 The purpose of the Voluntary Universal ACT Assessment Program is to:

17 (1) Improve the college readiness of all students in grade
18 eleven (11);

19 (2) To prevent or minimize the continued remediation of nearly
20 fifty percent (50%) of all students entering Arkansas institutions of higher
21 education in one (1) or more subjects because they do not meet the college
22 readiness score of nineteen (19) or higher on the ACT Assessment;

23 (3) Advance the number of students including students of low-
24 income, English language learners, and minority students taking the ACT
25 Assessment while in grade eleven (11) to increase the number of first
26 generation college students;

27 (4) Increase the college participation rates among all racial
28 and ethnic groups;

29 (5) Improve preparation for college and the workforce;

30 (6) Improve the course selection patterns of high school
31 students;

32 (7) Increase the early identification of college ready students;

33 (8) Support students participating in the Smart Core by
34 providing a baseline for their college and workforce readiness and an
35 opportunity to benefit from earlier remediation such as the College
36 Preparatory Enrichment Program or course selection review; and

1 (9) Provide a link between what students have learned, what they
2 need to learn, and what is necessary in order to be college or workforce
3 ready or both by providing expectations and measuring their progress.
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5 6-18-1605. Smart Core and ACT Assessment.

6 (a) The General Assembly finds that students who take the recommended
7 Smart Core courses or students who take additional courses after completing
8 the Smart Core continue to perform better on the ACT Assessment than students
9 who take less than the recommended core.

10 (b) The recommended core courses according to ACT Assessment officials
11 include:

12 (1) Four (4) years or more of English;

13 (2) Three (3) years or more of mathematics;

14 (3) Three (3) years or more of social studies; and

15 (4) Three (3) years or more of natural sciences.
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17 6-18-1606. Implementation.

18 Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, the Voluntary Universal ACT
19 Assessment Program may provide each student in grade eleven (11) with the
20 opportunity to take the ACT Assessment while in grade eleven (11) without any
21 charge by using school district funding, including National School Lunch Act
22 funds, to pay for the exams as approved by the Department of Education.
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24 6-18-1607. Rules.

25 The Arkansas Department of Higher Education and the Arkansas Department
26 of Education shall develop rules for the administration of this subchapter.
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28 6-18-1608. Reporting.

29 The Arkansas Department of Higher Education and the Arkansas Department
30 of Education shall submit a combined annual report to Legislative Council by
31 December 1 of each year that establishes compliance with this subchapter,
32 provides data on the number of participants in the Voluntary Universal ACT
33 Assessment Program, and outlines the impact of this program on the college-
34 readiness of high school seniors and the remediation rates at institutions of
35 higher education.
