10 IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE STATE MILITARY
11 DEPARTMENT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15 AN ACT FOR THE STATE MILITARY
16 DEPARTMENT REAPPROPRIATION.
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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. REAPPROPRIATION - FEDERAL FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,
22 to the State Military Department, to be payable from the federal funds as
23 designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for the State Military
24 Department, the following:

25 (A) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
26 Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of an Army
27 aviation support facility and hangar for new tactical helicopter equipment
28 and personnel, in a sum not to exceed\$22,700,000.
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30 (B) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
31 Item (B) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction and related
32 expenses for a Combined Support Maintenance Shop, in a sum not to exceed
33\$11,100,724.
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35 (C) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
36 Item (C) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction and related



1 expenses for an Ammunition Supply Point at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to
2 exceed\$3,415,799.

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4 (D) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
5 Item (D) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction and related
6 expenses for a Centralized Vehicle Wash Facility for cleaning heavy/tracked
7 vehicles, to provide vehicle maintenance for mechanized or tracked units and
8 related services, in a sum not to exceed\$1,065,600.

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10 (E) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
11 Item (E) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction and related
12 expenses for an Organizational Maintenance Shop in Searcy, Arkansas, in a sum
13 not to exceed\$1,373,986.

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15 (F) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
16 Item (G) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for constructing and equipping a
17 National Guard Military Operations Urban Terrain (MOUT) Training Facility, in
18 a sum not to exceed\$3,575,560.

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20 (G) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
21 Item (H) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for constructing and equipping the
22 National Guard Organizational Maintenance Shop in Jonesboro, Arkansas, in a
23 sum not to exceed\$1,970,520.

24
25 (H) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
26 Item (I) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for building an Army Aviation
27 Support Facility with a hangar and administrative space, in a sum not to
28 exceed\$10,922,520.

29
30 (I) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
31 Item (J) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of a new
32 Ammunition Supply Point at Fort Chaffee Maneuver Training Center for
33 ammunition storage, handling, shipment and administration, in a sum not to
34 exceed\$8,752,250.

35
36 (J) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in

1 Item (L) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of an access
2 control booth and electrically powered gates for traffic control/access to
3 the main entrance at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to exceed\$14,376,300.
4

5 (K) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
6 Item (M) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of a new
7 Ammunition Supply Point at Camp Robinson for ammunition storage, handling,
8 shipment and administration, in a sum not to exceed\$3,536,300.
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10 (L) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
11 Item (N) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of an access
12 control booth and electrically powered gates for traffic control/access to
13 the main entrance at the Fort Chaffee Maneuver Training Center, in a sum not
14 to exceed\$1,952,500.
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16 (M) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
17 Item (O) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of a "contonement"
18 or "central facility" area fence for the training area at Camp Robinson to
19 meet current anti-terrorism/force protection requirements, in a sum not to
20 exceed\$3,663,000.
21

22 (N) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
23 Item (P) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of a "contonement"
24 or "central facility" area fence for the training area at the Fort Chaffee
25 Maneuver Training Center to meet current/anti-terrorism/force protection
26 requirements, in a sum not to exceed\$3,663,000.
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28 (O) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
29 Item (Q) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of an additional
30 thirty-five (35) miles of fencing for the training area at Camp Robinson to
31 meet current anti-terrorism/force protection requirements, in a sum not to
32 exceed\$3,663,000.
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34 SECTION 2. REAPPROPRIATION - FEDERAL FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,
35 to the State Military Department, to be payable from the federal funds as
36 designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for the State Military

1 Department, the following:

2 (A) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
3 Item (A) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Readiness
4 Center in Jonesboro, in a sum not to exceed\$3,689,625.
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6 (B) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
7 Item (B) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Camp Robinson
8 Aviation Armory Addition, in a sum not to exceed\$3,804,159.
9

10 (C) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
11 Item (D) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Phase I
12 Regional Training Institute Complex, in a sum not to exceed\$5,918,402.
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14 (D) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
15 Item (E) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Combined
16 Support Maintenance Sub-Shop, in a sum not to exceed\$9,639,330.
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18 (E) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
19 Item (F) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Multi-Purpose
20 Machinegun/Sniper Range at Ft. Chaffee Maneuver Training Center, in a sum not
21 to exceed\$1,404,290.
22

23 (F) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
24 Item (G) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for CMTC Sewer Collection System
25 Repair/Replacement, in a sum not to exceed\$3,145,055.
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27 SECTION 3. REAPPROPRIATION - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDS. There is hereby
28 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the
29 General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, for the
30 State Military Department, the following:

31 (A) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
32 Item (B) of Section 2 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction, major
33 maintenance, repairs, asphalt paving and associated expenses at various
34 National Guard Armories including Warren, Mountain Home, West Memphis and an
35 Aviation Armory at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to exceed\$466,175.
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1 (B) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
2 Section 1 of Act 1847 of 2005, for critically needed maintenance for National
3 Guard Armories statewide for the State Military Department, in a sum not to
4 exceed\$653,304.
5

6 (C) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
7 Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 215 of 2005, for various maintenance,
8 renovation, equipping, construction, improvement, upgrade, and repair
9 projects and State match for State Armories, in a sum not to exceed
10\$1,250,000.
11

12 (D) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
13 Item (C) of Section 2 of Act 141 of 2005, for the rehabilitation of National
14 Guard Armories throughout the State to ensure combat and State emergency
15 readiness, in a sum not to exceed\$137,969.
16

17 (E) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
18 Item (E) of Section 2 of Act 141 of 2005, for alterations to existing
19 buildings to meet ADA regulations including ramps, restroom alterations,
20 passageway alterations and parking spaces, in a sum not to exceed ..\$174,800.
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22 SECTION 4. REAPPROPRIATION - MISCELLANEOUS REVENUE. There is hereby
23 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the Armory
24 Construction Fund, for the State Military Department, the following:

25 (A) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in
26 Item (A) of Section 4 of Act 141 of 2005, for repair, construction,
27 renovation, landscaping and maintenance of armories, hangars, and other
28 properties held for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard, in a
29 sum not to exceed\$128,292.
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31 SECTION 5. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor
32 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects
33 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available
34 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and
35 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and
36 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or

1 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State
 2 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects
 3 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds
 4 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General
 5 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall
 6 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

7 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing
 8 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue
 9 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State
 10 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,
 11 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any
 12 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.

13
 14 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
 15 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
 16 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
 17 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
 18 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
 19 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
 20 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
 21 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

 23 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
 24 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
 25 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that previous
 26 General Assemblies have provided appropriations for the projects provided or
 27 enumerated in this act; that certain appropriations will expire before the
 28 adjournment of the General Assembly; and that if such appropriations expire,
 29 the projects and programs authorized herein will cease thereby depriving the
 30 citizens of the State of the benefits to be derived from such projects.
 31 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
 32 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
 33 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its
 34 passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the
 35 Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time
 36 during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the

1 Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date
2 the last house overrides the veto.

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
