31	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-16-1202(2), concerning definition of a

33	(2) " Concurrent <u>Endorsed concurrent</u> enrollment course" means a

Arkansas Code § 6-16-1203 is amended to read as follows: 8 6-16-1203. Teacher skills and training. 9 (a)(1) A teacher of an advanced placement course must obtain 10 appropriate training. 11 (b)(1)(2) The State Board of Education shall establish clear, 12 specific, and challenging training guidelines that require teachers of 13 College Board advanced placement courses and teachers of pre-advanced 14 placement courses to obtain College Board sponsored or endorsed training. 15 (2)(3) The training may include vertical team training. 16 (b) An instructor of an endorsed concurrent enrollment course shall 17 have: (1)(A) No less than a master's degree that includes at least 18 eighteen (18) hours of completed course work in a subject matter related to 19 20 the endorsed concurrent enrollment course. 21 (B) The instructor's credentials shall be approved by the 22 academic unit or chief academic officer of the institution of higher 23 education offering the endorsed concurrent enrollment course; and 24 (2) Advanced skills as necessary to teach from the same syllabus 25 as is used at the institution of higher education. 26 27 SECTION 3. 34	(b) The panel shall consist of six (6) members as follows:
35	(1) Three (3) persons appointed by the Commissioner of
36	Education; and

1	(2) Three (3) persons appointed by the Director of the
2	Department of Higher Education.
3	(c) The appointed panel members shall be:

28	6-16-803. Definitions.
29	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
30	(1)(A) "Advanced placement course" means a high school level
31	preparatory course for a college advanced placement test that incorporates
32	all topics specified by the College Board and Educational Testing Service on
33	its standard syllabus for a given subject area and is approved by the College
34	Board and Educational Testing Service.
35	(B) "Preadvanced placement course" means a middle school,
36	junior high school, or high school level course that specifically prepares

1 students to enroll and participate in an advanced placement course; 2 (2) "Board" means the State Board of Education; (3)(2) "College advanced placement test" means the advanced 3 4 placement test administered by the College Board and Educational Testing 5 Service; 6 (4)(3) "College Board" means the College Board and Educational 7 Testing Service; 8 (5) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Education; 9 (4) "Endorsed concurrent enrollment course" means a college 10 level course offered by an institution of higher education: 11 (A) In one (1) of the four (4) core areas of math, 12 English, science, and social studies; (B) That meets the requirements of § 6-16-1204(c); and 13 (C) That upon completion would qualify for academic credit 14 15 in both the institution of higher education and a public high school; and 16 (6) "Department" means the Department of Education; 17 (7)(5)"International Baccalaureate Diploma Program" means an 18 international education program offered by the International Baccalaureate 19 Organization; and 20 (8) "Program" means the Arkansas Advanced Placement and 21 International Baccalaureate Diploma Incentive Program. 22 23 6-16-804. Established - Subsidies - Rules and regulations. 24 The Arkansas Advanced Placement, Endorsed Concurrent Enrollment, (a) 25 and International Baccalaureate Diploma Incentive Program is hereby 26 established, to be administered by the Commissioner of Education. 27 (b) Contingent upon legislative appropriations and based on criteria 28 established by the Department of Education, schools participating in the program may be awarded a one-time equipment and instructional materials grant 29 30 for providing an advanced placement course, an endorsed concurrent enrollment course, or a course offered under the International Baccalaureate Diploma 31 32 Program. 33 (c) Subject to legislative appropriations, a public school teacher 34 participating in the advanced placement program, in an endorsed concurrent 35 enrollment course, in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program, or in

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the preadvanced placement program may be awarded subsidized teacher training

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1 for the advanced placement courses, at a cost not to exceed six hundred fifty 2 dollars (\$650) per teacher. 3 (d)(1) Contingent upon legislative appropriation and the availability 4 of funding, the state may shall pay in full, or on a pro rata basis as 5 determined under subdivision (d)(2) of this section, the cost of: 6 (A) The advanced placement test fee; 7 (B) An equivalent stipend to a student enrolled in an 8 endorsed concurrent enrollment course; or 9 (C) the The equivalent test fee under the International 10 Baccalaureate Diploma Program, or both. 11 (2) The State Board of Education may create a sliding scale 12 based on family income. The board is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations 13 (e) 14 necessary to implement this subchapter. 15 16 6-16-805. Funding. 17 (a)(1) The awards, grants, and stipends granted under the provisions 18 of this subchapter for both advanced placement courses, endorsed concurrent 19 enrollment courses, and courses offered by the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program may be funded by donations, grants, or legislative 20 21 appropriation. 22 (b)(2) All donations, grants, and appropriations received shall 23 be accounted for by the Department of Education. 24 (b) An institution of higher education may waive or reduce the tuition for an endorsed concurrent enrollment course without penalty under the higher 25 26 education funding formulas. 27 The Commissioner of Education or the Director of the Department of (c) 28 Higher Education may solicit and receive donations and grants for the purpose 29 of making awards. 30 (d) The state's funding of an endorsed concurrent enrollment course shall not be less than the state's funding for paid for advanced placement 31 32 testing and staff development for an advanced placement course under this subchapter. 33 34 35 6-16-806. Treatment as advanced placement course. 36 Any high school course offered under the International Baccalaureate

1	Diploma Program shall be treated the same as an advanced placement course,
2	including for the following purposes:
3	(1) Weighted credit;
4	(2) The Arkansas Advanced Placement and the International
5	Baccalaureate Diploma Incentive Program Act of 1995; and
6	(3) Reporting requirements.
7	
8	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
9	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that many high school students
10	benefit from participating in endorsed concurrent enrollment courses; that
11	this act is necessary to ensure that students continue to have the
12	opportunity to enroll in endorsed concurrent enrollment classes; and that
13	this act is immediately necessary to allow school districts time to plan
14	schedules and hire staff prior to the 2007-2008 school year. Therefore, an
15	emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for
16	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
17	effective on:
18	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
19	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
20	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
21	<u>bill; or</u>
22	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
23	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
