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26	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas		
27	Community Assistance Commission, to be payable from the Arkansas Community		
28	Assistance Fund, for reimbursements, personal services and operating expenses		
29	of the Arkansas Community Assistance Commission for the fiscal year ending		
30	June 30, 2007, the s	um of	\$35,000.
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32	SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. <u>FUND CREATED</u> . (a) There is hereby created		
33	on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor of State, and Chief Fiscal		
34	Officer of the State a miscellaneous fund to be known as the Arkansas		
35		Fund. (b) This fund shall consist of	<u>.</u>

SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING 8 TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the Chief Fiscal 9 Officer of the State shall transfer on his or her books and those of the 10 State Treasurer and the Auditor of the State the sum of thirty five thousand 11 dollars (\$35,000) from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the 12 Arkansas Community Assistance Fund to provide funds for the appropriation 13 herein for the Arkansas Community Assistance Commission. 14 15 SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 16 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 17 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 18 19 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 20 21 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 22 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 23 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 24 25 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 26 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 27 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 28 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 29 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 30 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 31 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 32 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 33 SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 34 35 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 36

effectiveness of this Act on the date of its passage and approval is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond the date of its passage and approval could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.
