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23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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25 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - ARKANSAS REAL-TIME ELECTRONIC LOGBOOK. There is
26 hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas Crime Information Center, to be payable
27 from the Crime Information System Fund, for operating expenses of the
28 Arkansas Crime Information Center - Arkansas Real-Time Electronic Logbook for
29 the biennial period ending June 30, 2009, the following:

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5 SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING
7 TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this Act, the Chief Fiscal
8 Officer of the State shall transfer on his or her books and those of the
9 State Treasurer the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) from the
10 General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts to the Crime
11 Information System Fund for the initial costs of the "Arkansas Real-Time
12 Electronic Logbook."

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
14 through June 30, 2009.

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16 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
17 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
18 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
19 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
20 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
21 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
22 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
23 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
24 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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26 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
27 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
28 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
29 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
30 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
31 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
32 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
33 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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35 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
36 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the

appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.

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
