- 25 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
- 26 Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the City of Dumas, Arkansas was hit by
- 27 a tornado during the month of February, 2007; that the City has experienced
- 28 extreme damage, in some cases complete loss of property, and is not able to
- 29 meet the financial demands of the ongoing recovery efforts; and that this act
- 30 is immediately necessary to assist the City in meeting the needs of the
- 31 <u>citizens living in that area. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist</u>
- 32 <u>and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public</u>
- 33 peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
- 34 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
- 35 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the
- 36 expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill;
