20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

22 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-63-305(b), concerning new or additional
23 positions for institutions of higher education, is amended to read as
24 follows:

25 (b) The following maximum number of new additional positions is
26 established for the biennium for the following institutions of higher
27 education at salary rates not to exceed the salary rate of comparable
28 positions established in the regular salaries section of the biennial
29 appropriations act for operations for each institution:

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that institutions of higher education may receive additional revenue from sources other than general revenue; that revisions to the number of provisional positions may be necessary to serve the students enrolled for the 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 academic years; that this act is immediately necessary to prevent unnecessary delay in the education of students. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2007.
