27	SECTION 17. Arkansas Code § $6-21-806$, concerning the Academic
28	Facilities Master Plan Program school district plan requirements, is amended
29	to add an additional subsection to read as follows:
30	(e)(1) A school district may amend its facilities master plans at any
31	time during the ten-year cycle specified in § 6-21-803.
32	(2) An amendment may be submitted out of the regular even-year
33	<pre>cycle if the district:</pre>
34	(A) Has encountered:
35	(i) A major enrollment change;
36	(ii) A major curriculum change;

2	(iv) An unforeseen occurrence; or
3	(B)(i) Has begun or completed a self-funded construction

10	SECTION 18. Arkansas Code § 6-21-811(a), concerning the Academic
11	Facilities Distress Program. is amended to read as follows:
12	(a) The Division of Public School Academic Facilities and
13	Transportation shall identify a public school or school district as being in
14	academic facilities distress if the division determines that the public
15	school or school district has engaged in actions or inactions that result in
16	any of the following:
17	(1) Any act or violation determined by the division to
18	jeopardize any academic facility used by a public school or school district,
19	including, but not limited to:
20	(A) Material failure to properly maintain academic
21	facilities in accordance with this subchapter and rules adopted by the
22	Commission for Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation;
23	(B) Material violation of local, state, or federal fire,
24	health, or safety code provisions or laws;
25	(C) Material violation of applicable building code
26	provisions or law;
27	(D) Material failure to provide timely and accurate
28	facilities master plans to the division;
29	(E) Material failure to comply with state law governing
30	purchasing or bid requirements in relation to academic facilities projects;
31	or
32	(F) Material default on any school district debt
33	obligation; or
34	(G) Material failure to plan and progress satisfactorily
35	toward accomplishing the priorities established by the division and the
36	approved school district master plans; or

1	(2) Any other condition of an academic facility or facilities in
2	a public school or school district that is determined by the division to have
3	a detrimental impact on educational services provided by that public school
4	or school district.
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
