19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-20-1406 is repealed.

22 ~~6-20-1406. Standards for school construction.~~

23 ~~(a) The State Board of Education shall establish reasonable minimum~~  
24 ~~standards for schoolhouse construction, and standards may be revised from~~  
25 ~~time to time as educational problems and methods of procedure develop and~~  
26 ~~change.~~

27 ~~(b) The standards shall include review and approval by all appropriate~~  
28 ~~and applicable state agencies, boards, and local officials for, including,~~  
29 ~~but not limited to, the following:~~

30 ~~(1) Plumbing Code, § 17-38-101 et seq., and Heating,~~

9 ~~Public School Academic Facility Manual as adopted by the Commission for~~

12 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-20-1407 is amended to read as follows:  
13 6-20-1407. Approval of building plans.

14 (a) No new schoolhouse shall be built except in accordance with the  
15 plan finally approved by the Commission for Public School Academic Facilities  
16 and Transportation for all projects where the commission requires its  
17 approval.

18 (b) ~~When so required by the commission, a~~ A copy of approved plans and  
19 specifications of all new schoolhouses or additions shall be filed with and  
20 approved by the commission before construction shall be commenced.

21 (c) The approval process established by the commission shall include  
22 review and approval by all appropriate and applicable state agencies, boards,  
23 and local officials necessary to meet the standard contained in the Arkansas  
24 Public School Academic Facility Manual;

25 ~~(e)-(1)(d)(1)~~ A copy of final construction documents shall be submitted  
26 to the Architectural Section of Arkansas Building Authority for review in  
27 regard to compliance with the Arkansas-adopted Accessibility Guidelines  
28 (ADAAG-Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines).

29 (2) All review comments received from the authority shall be in  
30 writing.

31 (3) Corrected construction documents shall be received and  
32 approved by the authority.

33 (4) No project shall be released for bidding or construction  
34 until the requirements of ~~§ 6-20-1406 and~~ this section are met.

35 ~~(d)~~(e) Review and approval of plans under this section or otherwise  
36 shall not be a guarantee of state financial participation in any public

1 school academic facilities project.

2 (f)(1) As used in this subsection (f), a self-funded project is a  
 3 project that is one hundred percent (100%) funded by the school district.

4 (2) The project shall be approved upon compliance with state  
 5 codes and standards.

6 (3) A self-funded project may be submitted in the form of an  
 7 appendix to the existing district master plan at any time.

9 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2503(a), concerning definitions of  
 10 terms for school district bonded indebtedness, is amended to read as follows:

11 6-20-2503. Bonded debt assistance.

12 (a) As used in this section:

13 (1) "Eligible school district" means a school district that  
 14 applied for bonded debt assistance under this section before July 1, 2005;

15 ~~(1)(2)~~ (2) "Foundation funding" means an amount of money specified  
 16 by the General Assembly for each school year to be expended by school  
 17 districts for the provision of an adequate education for each student as that  
 18 amount is established in § 6-20-2305;

19 ~~(2)(3)~~ (3) "Local revenue per student" means in each school year  
 20 ninety-eight percent (98%) of the amount of revenue available, whether or not  
 21 collected, in a school district solely from the levy of the uniform rate of  
 22 tax plus seventy-five percent (75%) of the average miscellaneous funds  
 23 collected in the previous five (5) years or the previous year, whichever is  
 24 less, divided by the average daily membership of the school district;

25 ~~(3)(4)~~ (4) "Miscellaneous funds" means those funds received by a  
 26 local school district from federal forest reserves, federal grazing rights,  
 27 federal mineral rights, federal impact aid, federal flood control, wildlife  
 28 refuge funds, severance taxes, funds received by the district in lieu of  
 29 taxes, and local sales and use taxes dedicated to education pursuant to §§  
 30 26-74-201 et seq., 26-74-301 et seq., 26-75-301 et seq., and 14-164-301 et  
 31 seq.; and

32 ~~(4)(5)~~ (5) "State wealth index" means the result of one (1) minus  
 33 the ratio of local revenue per student divided by the difference between  
 34 foundation funding and local revenue per student.

36 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2503(b)(3)(A) is amended to read as

1 follows:

2 (3)(A) The Commission for Arkansas Public School Academic  
3 Facilities and Transportation shall determine the amount of financial  
4 assistance for each eligible school district as follows:

5 (i)(a) For the year that financial assistance under  
6 this section will be provided, ascertain the scheduled debt payment on a  
7 fiscal year basis from the principal and interest payment schedule in effect  
8 and on file with the department on January 1, 2005, and reduce the amount of  
9 the payment by ten percent (10%) except as provided in subdivision  
10 (b)(3)(A)(i)(b) of this section.

11 (b)(1) If a school district can demonstrate to  
12 the satisfaction of the commission that all or a portion of the ten percent  
13 (10%) reduction in its scheduled debt payment under subdivision  
14 (b)(3)(A)(i)(a) of this section can be attributed to the support of academic  
15 facilities, the commission shall reverse all or a portion of the ten percent  
16 (10%) reduction by a percentage proportionate to the amount attributable to  
17 academic facilities.

18 (2) A school district that applied to  
19 the commission during the 2006-2007 school year for a reversal of the ten  
20 percent (10%) reduction but was denied the reversal by the commission due to  
21 the failure of the school district to submit timely appeals shall be entitled  
22 to receive bonded debt assistance for the relevant period of the program  
23 beginning with the 2007-2008 school year in the amount approved by the  
24 Academic Facilities Division;

25 (ii) For the year that financial assistance will be  
26 provided, divide the scheduled debt payment as adjusted under subdivision  
27 (b)(3)(A)(i) by the total assessed valuation of taxable real, personal, and  
28 utility property in the school district as shown by the applicable county  
29 assessment for the most recent year with the result multiplied by one  
30 thousand (1,000);

31 (iii)(a) Multiply the calculation under subdivision  
32 (b)(3)(A)(ii) of this section by a funding factor per average daily  
33 membership that will distribute a total amount of state financial assistance  
34 no less than the total amount of funds that would have been distributed  
35 during fiscal year 2005 if every school district in the state had received an  
36 amount of state financial assistance equal to an amount calculated by

1 applying the debt service funding supplement formula under the Supplemental  
2 School District Funding Act of 2003, § 6-20-2401 et seq., during fiscal year  
3 2005 with a funding factor of eighteen dollars three cents (\$18.03).

4 (b) The funding factor for each fiscal year  
5 after Fiscal Year 2006 shall be equal to the funding factor derived for  
6 Fiscal Year 2006 under subdivision (b)(3)(A)(iii)(a) of this section; and

7 (iv) Multiply the calculation under subdivision  
8 (b)(3)(A)(iii) of this section by the state wealth index.

10 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2503, concerning school district  
11 bonded debt assistance, is amended to add an additional subsection to read as  
12 follows:

13 (g)(1)(A) Within thirty (30) days after the satisfaction of a school  
14 district's outstanding bonded indebtedness in existence as of January 1,  
15 2005, the school district shall notify the department that the school  
16 district's outstanding bonded indebtedness in existence as of January 1,  
17 2005, has been satisfied.

18 (B)(i) If a school district has issued refunding bonds to  
19 refund bonds in existence as of January 1, 2005, or has defeased bonds that  
20 were in existence as of January 1, 2005, the school district shall notify the  
21 department of the date that the school district's outstanding bonded  
22 indebtedness in existence as of January 1, 2005, would have been satisfied  
23 had the bonds not been refunded or defeased.

24 (ii) The notification shall be provided within  
25 thirty (30) days after the date that the school district's outstanding bonded  
26 indebtedness in existence as of January 1, 2005, would have been satisfied.

27 (2)(A) Within thirty (30) days after receiving notification  
28 under subdivision (g)(1)(A) of this section, the department shall certify to  
29 the commission that all school district outstanding bonded indebtedness in  
30 existence as of January 1, 2005, has been satisfied.

31 (B) Upon acceptance by the commission of the department's  
32 certification, state financial participation under this section shall expire.

34 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2504, concerning the Academic  
35 Facilities Immediate Repair Program, is amended to add an additional

1           (h)(1) Within thirty (30) days after the completion of all approved  
2 immediate repair projects, the division shall certify to the commission that  
3 all approved immediate repair projects have been completed and all approved  
4 state financial participation under this section has been distributed.

5           (2) Upon acceptance by the commission of the division's  
6 certification, the Academic Facilities Immediate Repair Program shall expire.

7           (3) An approved project that is not verified as being complete  
8 by January 1, 2008, shall be declared canceled by the commission and program  
9 funds shall be reallocated as the commission directs.

10  
11           SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2505(b), concerning the time limit for  
12 school districts to apply for support in the purchase of academic equipment,  
13 is amended to read as follows:

14           (b) A school district may apply for state financial participation to  
15 support the purchase of academic equipment if:

16           (1) The school district's application is received by the  
17 division no later than July 1, 2005;

18           (2) The need for the academic equipment was in existence on  
19 January 1, 2005; and

20           (3) The academic equipment supports an adequate education as  
21 described in § 6-20-2302.

22  
23           SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2506, concerning the Transitional  
24 Academic Facilities Program, is amended to add an additional subsection to  
25 read as follows:

26           (g)(1) Within thirty (30) days after the completion of all projects  
27 approved under this section, the division shall certify to the commission  
28 that all projects approved under this section have been completed and all  
29 state financial participation approved under this section has been  
30 distributed.

31           (2) Upon acceptance by the commission of the division's  
32 certification, the Transitional Academic Facilities Program shall expire.

33           (3) An approved project that is not verified as being complete  
34 by July 1, 2009, shall be declared canceled by the commission and program  
35 funds shall be reallocated as the commission directs.

1 SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2507(b), concerning state financial  
2 participation in new academic facility construction, is amended to read as  
3 follows:

4 (b) *In order to apply for state financial participation in a new*  
5 *construction project, a school district shall provide the division with a*  
6 ~~*copy of the design plans*~~ detailed narrative, description, and justification  
7 for the project and evidence of:

8 (1) Preparation for the new construction project as demonstrated  
9 by inclusion of the new construction project in the school district's  
10 facilities master plan;

11 (2)(A) The adoption of a resolution certifying to the division  
12 the school district's dedication of local resources to meet the school  
13 district's share of financial participation in the new construction project.

14 (B) The resolution shall specify the approximate date that  
15 the board of directors of the school district intends to seek elector  
16 approval of any bond or tax measures or to apply other local resources to pay  
17 the school district's share of financial participation in the new  
18 construction project;

19 (3)(A) The total estimated cost of the new construction project  
20 that shall be a minimum of three hundred dollars (\$300) per student or one  
21 hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) whichever is less.

22 (B) The minimum requirement set forth in subdivision  
23 (b)(3)(A) of this section may be waived by the division upon a recommendation  
24 being made by the Director of the Division of Public School Academic  
25 Facilities and Transportation to the Commissioners for the Division of Public  
26 School Academic Facilities and Transportation for the minimum to be waived  
27 for cause and a majority of the commission votes to support the waiver;

28 (4) The new construction project's conformance with sound  
29 educational practices;

30 (5) The new construction project's compliance with current  
31 academic facilities standards, including, without limitation, appropriate

34 (6) The allocation of project costs between new construction  
35 activities and maintenance, repair, and renovation activities if the new  
36 construction project includes improvements that could be classified as

3 resourceful expenditure of state funds and improves the school district's  
4 ability to deliver an adequate and equitable education to public school  
5 students in the district.

7 SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2507(d)(1), concerning state

19 participation under this section, the division shall certify the amount of  
20 state financial participation to the Commission for Arkansas Public School  
21 Academic Facilities and Transportation for oversight purposes.

22 (B) The amount of state financial participation under this  
23 section is limited to the amount resulting from the application of the  
24 academic facilities wealth index to the project cost promulgated by the  
25 commission to calculate the cost necessary to bring the academic facility  
26 into compliance with the Arkansas Public School Academic Facility Manual  
27 under § 6-20-2509.

14 students in the district; and

15 (4) Proof of full replacement value insurance to include a  
16 provision requiring code upgrades.

14 (B) Additions to existing academic facilities; and

15 (C) Major improvements to academic facilities that bring  
16 the state of condition or efficiency of the academic facility to a state of  
17 condition or efficiency better than the facility's original condition of  
18 completeness or efficiency.

20 SECTION 15. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 20, Subchapter 25 is  
21 amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

22 6-20-2515. Review conferences.

23 (a) After February 1, 2008, a district may request and be granted by  
24 the division a review conference that shall be held within twenty (20)  
25 working days after the date of request.

26 (b) The district may be advised through the review conference process  
27 by an architectural and engineering firm if the school district pays the cost  
28 of the advice from the architectural and engineering firm.

29 (c) The review conference shall consider the following:

30 (1) That the proposed project is academic;

31 (2) The application of the space calculation to the project  
32 agreed upon by the district and the division;

33 (3) The wealth index of the district and the date at which the  
34 wealth index will be applied to the partnership project if approved;

35 (4) The project cost promulgated by the commission under § 6-20-  
36 2509, for the project and the date on which the project cost data will be

1 applied to the partnership project if approved; and

2 (5) A projected amount of state funding based on current

10 responsibilities of the Division of Public School Academic Facilities and

13 (1) Provide information or assistance to the Academic Facilities  
14 Oversight Committee as requested;

15 (2) Use any recommendation or assessments of the oversight  
16 committee or the General Assembly as a basis for establishing the policies  
17 and procedures of the division;

18 (3) Develop and implement the Arkansas Public School Academic  
19 Facilities Program Act as established in § 6-21-801 et seq.;

20 (4) Administer the various programs of state financial  
21 participation in support of local academic facilities;

22 (5) Develop and implement an ongoing uniform process for  
23 collecting, inventorying, and updating information on the state of condition  
24 of all public school academic facilities in the state;

25 (6) Develop a facility cost index that provides a methodology  
26 for comparing the cost of repairing the condition of a public school academic  
27 facility to the cost of replacing the public school academic facility with a

34 (9) Develop guidelines for competitive bidding, competitive  
35 negotiation, and other methods of procurement for public school academic  
36 facilities projects;

1           (10) Develop incentive programs to reward school districts for  
2 innovative, effective, and efficient use of local and state resources with  
3 regard to public school academic facilities;

4           (11) Administer the school transportation program in the various  
5 school districts of Arkansas, including, without limitation, the training of  
6 school bus drivers and inspection of buses or other vehicles used in  
7 transporting public school students;

8           (12) Keep records showing a description of each school district  
9 in the state, a map showing the school districts with current and accurate  
10 boundaries, the location of the academic facilities, and the electoral zones,  
11 if any, into which each school district has been divided;

12           (13) Report by October 1 of each year to the Governor, the House  
13 Committee on Education, the Senate Committee on Education, and the Academic  
14 Facilities Oversight Committee on the state of condition of academic  
15 facilities statewide using the following building and design systems:

16           (A)(i) Site land and all improvements to the site, such as  
17 grading, drainage, drives, parking areas, walks, landscaping, and  
18 playgrounds.

19                   (ii) Site improvements shall not include permanent  
20 or temporary buildings;

21           (B) Roofing;

22           (C) Exterior;

23           (D) Structure;

24           (E) Interior;

25           (F) Heating, ventilation, and air conditioning;

28           (I) Technology;

29           (J) Fire and safety;

30           (K) Specialty items, including equipment and furnishings;

32           (L) Space utilization;

33           (14) Report by October 1 of each even-numbered year to the

35 Education, and the Academic Facilities Oversight Committee on the state

1 (15) Maintain a public access website dedicated to public school  
2 academic facilities; and

3 (16) Develop and implement a state-wide facilities needs  
4 priority list that provides a methodology for:

5 (A) Prioritization of state school district facility  
6 needs; and

7 (B) Comparing the school district advancement of improving  
8 facility conditions with school district master plans.

9  
10 SECTION 16. Arkansas Code § 6-21-806(a) and(b), concerning the  
11 Academic Facilities Master Plan Program, are amended to read as follows:

12 (a) The Academic Facilities Master Plan Program shall require each  
13 school district to:

14 (1) Develop a ten-year districtwide facilities master plan that  
15 shall be approved by the school district's board of directors for submission  
16 to and approval by the Division of Public School Academic Facilities and  
17 Transportation;

18 (2) Base its facilities master plan on the provisions of the  
19 Public School Academic Facility Manual as adopted by the Commission for  
20 Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation and on priorities  
21 indicated by statewide assessment, on priorities established by the division  
22 statewide facility needs priority list, and other pertinent data specific to  
23 the needs of the school district with regard to academic facilities and  
24 equipment;

25 (3) Present a draft of the school district's facilities master  
26 plan in a public hearing in the same locality as the school district and take  
27 public comments;

28 (4) Submit evidence of the school district's insurance coverage  
29 to the division by July 1, ~~2006~~ of each even numbered year, including  
30 coverage amounts, types of coverage, identification of buildings covered,  
31 policy renewal dates, and all riders;

32 (5) Submit the school district's facilities master plan with a  
33 summary of comments made at public hearing to the division by February 1 of  
34 each even-numbered year; and

35 (6) Submit a report to the division by February 1 of each odd-  
36 numbered year that includes a description of all projects completed in the

1 school district since the submission of the school district's most recent  
2 facilities master plan, the school district's current enrollment projections,  
3 new or continuing needs of the school district with regard to academic  
4 facilities and equipment, and an accounting of any changes in the school  
5 district's insurance coverage from the most recent submission.

6 (b) A facilities master plan shall include, at a minimum, the  
7 following:

8 (1) A schedule of custodial activities for each public school  
9 facility used by a school district;

10 (2) A schedule of maintenance, repair, and renovation activities  
11 for each public school facility used by a school district. The schedule shall  
12 distinguish between work associated with academic facilities and work  
13 associated with nonacademic public school facilities;

14 (3) Documentation that describes preventive maintenance work for  
15 each public school facility and identifies the completion date of the work.  
16 The documentation shall distinguish between preventive maintenance work
