9	SECTION 3. Definitions.		
10	As used in this act:		
11	(1) "Economically distressed area" means a county-wide area in		
12	Arkansas in which the percentage of families that earn income below poverty		
13	level exceeds twenty-three percent (23%), based on year 2000 income levels as		
14	compiled by the Bureau of the Census, United States Department of Commerce		
15	demographic profiles;		
16	(2) "Geotourism" means tourism that sustains or enhances the		
17	geographical character of an area including without limitation, its		
18	environment, heritage, aesthetics, culture, natural resources, and well-being		
19	of its residents.		
20	(3) "Geotourism attraction" means an environmental, aesthetic,		
21	cultural, or natural point of interest in an area of natural phenomena or		
22	scenic beauty that attracts tourists to experience and appreciate the		
23	environmental, aesthetic, cultural, or natural point of interest including		
24	without limitation:		
25	(A) A geological monument;		
26	(B) A lake;		
27	(C) A mountain;		
28	(D) A park;		
29	(E) A river;		
30	(F) A species of animal abundant or unique to a particular		
31	area;		
32	(G) A species of bird abundant or unique to a particular		
33	area;		
34	(H) A species of insect abundant or unique to a particular

2	(4)(A) "Geotourism-supporting business" means a business
3	necessary to support a geotourism attraction by constructing, expanding or
4	re-modeling a retail facility including without limitation, cultural or
5	educational centers, indoor or outdoor plays or music shows, recreational or
6	entertainment facilities, sporting goods retail and rental establishments,
7	guide services, transient lodging facilities including RV parks, arts and
8	antique shops, campgrounds, bed and breakfasts, and dining establishments.
9	(B) "Geotourism-supporting business" does not include:
10	(i) Facilities that are not open to the general
11	<pre>public; or</pre>
12	(ii) Facilities owned by the State of Arkansas or a
13	political subdivision of the state.
14	(5) "Geotourist" means a person who travels to an area to enjoy
15	the area's natural habitats, heritage sites, scenic appeals, and local
16	culture;
17	(6) "Lower Mississippi River Delta" means a county in Arkansas
18	or portion of a county in Arkansas whose land area includes an alluvial plair
19	created by the Mississippi River; and
20	(7) "Person or entity" means a sole proprietorship, partnership,
21	LLC, or corporation.

23	SECTION 3. Income tax credit for geotourism development.
24	(a) To qualify for an income tax credit under this act, a person or
25	entity shall invest a minimum of twenty-five thousand dollars ($\$25,000$) in a
26	geotourism-supporting business located in the Lower Mississippi River Delta
27	that meets the following criteria:
28	(1) In an economically distressed area;
29	(2) In an incorporated area or a city with a population of less
30	than sixteen-thousand (16,000) as determined by the U.S. Census Report of
31	<u>2000;</u>
32	(3) Within five (5) miles of a national scenic byway; and
33	(4) Within fifteen (15) miles of:
34	(A) Public access to a navigable river; or
35	(B) An Arkansas State Park; or
36	(C) An Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission Wildlife

1	Management Area; or		
2	(D) A National Wildlife Refuge.		
3	(b)(1) A person or entity is eligible to receive an income tax credit		
4	under this act equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of the amount of an		
5	investment for a purpose described in subsection (a) of this section for the		
6	year that the investment is made provided that the geotourism-supporting		
7	business is currently operating as a business.		
8	(2) For any tax year, the maximum amount of investment to be		
9	considered in determining the income tax credit under this act is one hundre		
10	thousand dollars (\$100,000).		
11			
12	SECTION 4. Rules and regulations.		
13	(a) The Department of Finance and Administration shall promulgate		
14	rules necessary to implement this act.		
15	(b) The Department of Finance and Administration shall consult with		
16	the Arkansas Department of Parks and Tourism in promulgating rules under this		
17	act.		
18	(c) The Department of Finance and Administration and the Arkansas		
19	Department of Parks and Tourism may inspect facilities and records of a		
20	person or an entity requesting or receiving an income tax credit under this		
21	act as necessary to verify a claim.		
22			
23	SECTION 5. Expiration.		
24	(a) This act expires at the end of the 2011 tax year.		
25	(b) If the geotourism-supporting business is currently operating as a		
26	business, an unused income tax credit under this act may be carried forward		
27	on an income tax return for five (5) years after the year in which the income		
28	tax credit was first earned or until exhausted, whichever event occurs first.		
29			
30	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General		
31	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Lower Mississippi River Delta is		
32	an area of the state that is rich in culture, diversity, history and natural		
33	environmental beauty and yet is economically distressed; that the developmen		
34	of a geotourism industry in the Lower Mississippi River Delta will spur		
35	growth and economic opportunity for all Arkansans; and that the economy of		
36	the Lower Mississippi River Delta cannot withstand any delay of economic		

1	incentive or relief. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this		
2	act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and		
3	safety shall become effective on:		
4	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
5	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
6	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
7	bill; or		
8	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
9	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
