33	SECTION 1. Arkansas Co	ode Title 6, Chapter 82	is amended to add an	
34	additional subchapter to read as follows:			
35	Subchapter 17 — Higher	Education Opportunitie	s Grant Program.	
36	6-28-1701. Legislative	e intent.		

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1	(a) The General Assembly finds that tuition assistance to low-income
2	students is a key contributor to college and workforce success.
3	(b) Tuition assistance will significantly enhance the ability of low
4	income students to obtain college degrees and be productive citizens of
5	Arkansas and correspondingly benefit the State of Arkansas as a whole.
6	
7	6-82-1702. Definitions.
8	As used in this act:
9	(1)(A) "Approved institution" means a public or private
10	institution of higher education located in Arkansas that:
11	(i) Is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission
12	of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools; or
13	(ii) Certifies to the Department of Higher Education
14	that its students are accepted for transfer at institutions accredited by the
15	Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and
16	Schools.
17	(B) "Approved institution" does not include an institution
18	of higher education that discriminates against applicants, students, or
19	employees on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap, or
20	national origin consistent with the provisions of applicable state and
21	federal law;
22	(2) "Eligible student" means a student who meets the criteria
23	set out by this subchapter and is deemed to be eligible by rules authorized
24	by this act and promulgated by the Department of Higher Education;
25	(3) "Financial need" means the family income of program
26	applicants as determined by the Department of Higher Education through
27	evaluation of program applications and supporting documentation;
28	(4) "Full-time undergraduate student" means a resident of
29	Arkansas who attends an approved institution of higher education and is
30	enrolled in at least twelve (12) credit hours or the equivalent the first
31	semester and fifteen (15) credit hours or the equivalent thereafter, as
32	defined by rule of the Department of Higher Education, in a program of study
33	that leads to or is creditable toward an associate degree or a baccalaureate
34	<pre>degree;</pre>
35	(5) "High school graduate" means any student who graduates from
36	an Arkansas high school during the twelve-month period immediately preceding

1	the year of application for a grant under this subchapter;	
2	(6) "High school graduate equivalent" means any student between	
3	sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years of age who passes the General	
4	Development Education Test in Arkansas during the twelve-month period	
5	immediately preceding the year of application to this program;	
6	(7) "Part-time undergraduate student" means a resident of	
7	Arkansas who attends an approved institution of higher education and is	
8	enrolled in at least six (6) credit hours per semester or the equivalent but	
9	no more than twelve (12) credit hours or the equivalent the first semester	
10	and fifteen (15) credit hours or the equivalent thereafter, as defined by	
11	rule of the Department of Higher Education, in a program of study that leads	
12	to or is creditable towards an associate degree or a baccalaureate degree;	
13	<u>and</u>	
14	(8) "Unemancipated child" or "unemancipated children" means a	
15	dependent child or dependent children as defined by the United States	
16	Department of Education for student aid purposes.	
17		
18	6-82-1703. Establishment.	
19	The Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program is established to	
20	increase the opportunities of low-income students to pursue higher education	
21	opportunities.	
22		
23	6-82-1704. Eligibility.	
24	(a) Eligibility for the Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program	
25	shall be based on criteria established by rule of the Department of Higher	
26	Education.	
27	(b) The criteria established by the department shall include the	
28	<pre>following:</pre>	
29	(1) An applicant shall be a citizen of the United States or a	
30	permanent resident alien;	
31	(2) An applicant shall have graduated from an Arkansas high	
32	school or passed the General Development Education Test in Arkansas within	
33	twelve (12) months of first enrolling as a full-time or part-time, first-time	
34	student at an approved institution of higher education;	
35	(3) An applicant shall have been a resident of the state of	
36	Arkansas for at least twelve (12) months prior to graduation from an Arkansas	

1	nigh school of the date of notification of completion of the General
2	Development Education Test, and the applicant and his or her custodial parent
3	or guardian shall have maintained Arkansas residency for the same period of
4	time;
5	(4) An applicant shall be accepted for admission to an approved
6	institution of higher education as a full-time or part-time first-time
7	student, as defined by the Department of Higher Education, and shall enroll
8	in an approved institution within twelve (12) months of high school
9	graduation or notification of successful completion of the General
10	Development Education Test;
11	(5) An applicant shall certify that he or she is drug-free and
12	shall pledge in writing on the application form to refrain from the use or
13	abuse of illegal substances; and
14	(6)(A) An applicant shall demonstrate financial need as
15	determined by the Department of Higher Education.
16	(B) In determining financial need, the following criteria
17	shall be used:
18	(i) An applicant whose family includes one (1)
19	unemancipated child shall have an average family adjusted gross income not
20	exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) per year at the time of
21	application to the program;
22	(ii) An applicant whose family includes more than
23	one unemancipated child shall add an additional five thousand dollars
24	(\$5,000) per child to the base income of twenty-five thousand dollars
25	(\$25,000); and
26	(iii) The Department of Higher Education shall have
27	the authority to adjust these financial need family income requirements on an
28	annual basis, using the federal Consumer Price Index to make any necessary
29	changes. Other financial need criteria necessary for the selection of
30	recipients, including those defined as emancipated or independent by federal
31	student aid regulations, shall be established through rules issued by the
32	Department of Higher Education.
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34	6-82-1705. Recipients.
35	(a) Students who receive grants under this subchapter shall be known
36	as Higher Education Opportunities Grant recipients.

1	(b) An eligible recipient shall receive a grant for one (1) academic	
2	year, renewable for up to a total cumulative award amount of four thousand	
3	dollars (\$4,000) if the recipient meets continuing eligibility criteria	
4	established by rule of the Department of Higher Education.	
5	(c) The amount of the annual grant awarded to each recipient shall be	
6	one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for full-time students and five hundred dollars	
7	(\$500) for part-time students.	
8	(d) No student's total financial aid package, including multiple	
9	scholarships, shall exceed the recognized cost of attendance at an	
10	institution of higher education.	
11		
12	6-82-1706. Rules.	
13	(a) The Department of Higher Education shall promulgate rules for the	
14	administration of the Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program consistent	
15	with the purposes and requirements of this subchapter.	
16	(b) The rules shall include:	
17	(1) Student eligibility criteria incorporating the requirements	
18	of this subchapter;	
19	(2) A method for selecting grant recipients;	
20	(3) A method for determining continuing eligibility;	
21	(4) Procedures for making payment to recipients; and	
22	(5) Other administrative procedures necessary for the	
23	implementation and operation of the program.	
24		
25	6-82-1707. Administrative Costs.	
26	The Department of Higher Education is authorized to expend each year up	
27	to two percent (2%) of the amount appropriated for the Higher Education	
28	Opportunities Grant Program for data processing and other administrative	
29	costs of the program.	
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31	6-82-1708. Informational materials.	
32	The Department of Education and the Department of Higher Education	
33	shall develop appropriate informational materials on the Higher Education	
34	Opportunities Grant Program for distribution to all Arkansas students in	
35	grades seven (7) through twelve (12) each year as part of the packet of	
36	materials on pre-collegiate preparation distributed by the Department of	

1	Education.
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3	6-82-1709. Program evaluation.
4	The Director of the Department of Higher Education may review and
5	evaluate the operation of the Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program
6	with regard to eligibility criteria and size of the grant award to ensure
7	that the program's operation meets the intent of this legislation.
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
