- 25 (2) A constable shall have access to information from the center 26 if the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training 27 certifies that the constable has completed the course required by § 14-14-28 1314.
- (d)(1) The State Board of Law Examiners shall be deemed to be a regulatory agency having specific statutory access to the records of the 31 center as provided by subsection (a) of this section.
- 32 (2) In that capacity, the State Board of Law Examiners shall 33 require each applicant for admission to the Bar of Arkansas to be 34 fingerprinted.
- 35 (3) The center is authorized to accept fingerprints or other 36 information provided to it by the State Board of Law Examiners and is further

     information, including state, multistate, and Federal Bureau of Investigation

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           14-14-1314. Constable training requirements — Uniform requirements.
           (a)(1)(A) For a constable to have access to information from the
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     Arkansas Crime Information Center, he or she shall satisfactorily complete
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15
     the constable training course provided by the Arkansas Commission on Law
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     Enforcement Standards and Training.
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                       (B) For a constable to carry a firearm, he or she shall
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     annually:
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                             (i) Attend sixteen (16) hours of firearms training;
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     and
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                             (ii) Satisfy the firearm qualification standards for
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     a law enforcement official.
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                 (2) A constable holding office on the effective date of this
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     section is exempt from the requirements of subdivision (a)(1) of this section
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     if the constable has completed:
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                       (A) The part-time II law enforcement training or higher
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     level training course; and
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                       (B) Mandatory racial profiling courses.
           (b)(1) In the performance of his or her official duties, a constable
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     shall wear a uniform consisting of:
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                       (A) The following shirts:
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                             (i) A long sleeve shirt with a gray tie from October
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     l until March 31;
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                             (ii) A black shirt with black epaulets and black
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     pocket flaps from April 1 until September 30; or
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                             (iii) A white shirt on formal occasions at any time;
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1	(B)(i) A constable identification patch on the left		
2	shoulder of the shirt and an American flag on the right shoulder.		
3	(ii) The top of each patch shall be one inch (1")		
4	down from the shoulder seam of the shirt;		
5	(C) A name tag above the right pocket flap of the shirt;		
6	(D) A six-point star, containing the words "Arkansas		
7	Constable" shall be on the left side of the shirt;		
8	(E) The following pants:		
9	(i) Tan pants; or		
10	(ii) Blue or black pants on formal occasions; and		
11	(F) A gray hat with a six-point star on the front

20	shall drive a motor vehicle that is clearly marked with a six-point star and		
21	the words "Arkansas Constable".		
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23	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 9, Subchapter 1 is amended		
24	to add an additional section to read as follows:		
25	12-9-115. Training for constables.		
26	After consultation with the Arkansas Constables Association, the		
27	Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training shall develop a		
28	training course of one hundred twenty (120) hours to one hundred sixty (160)		
29	hours for new constables.		
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
