34	(a) In order to improve the health status and educational achievement

2 (b) For purposes of this section, "school nurse" means a licensed3 nurse engaging in school nursing activities.

4 (c)(1) Beginning with the 2004-2005 2007-2008 school year, all school
5 districts shall have no fewer than the full-time equivalent of one (1) school
6 nurse per seven hundred fifty (750) students or the proportionate ratio
7 thereof.

(2) The General Assembly finds that:

9 (A) The foundation funding provided under § 6-20-2305(a)
10 allocates two and one-half (2 1/2) full-time equivalent pupil support

11 positions for a five-hundred-student school; and

12 (B) There is sufficient foundation funding from those

13 pupil support positions for sixty-seven one-hundredths (.67) of a full-time

17 (2)(3) In districts having a high concentration of children with 18 disabling conditions as determined by the State Board of Education, the ratio 19 of school nurses to students should be one (1) to four hundred (400) in those 20 schools so designated.

21 (3)(4) In a district which provides a center for profoundly22 disabled students, the ratio should be one (1) school nurse per one hundred23 twenty-five (125) students at that center.

24 (d)(1) School nurses may be employed or provided by contract or 25 agreement with other agencies or individuals provided that the prescribed 26 ratio and equivalency are maintained.

(2) However, no school nurse may be employed by, or contract
with, any public secondary or elementary school of this state except with the
prior approval of the local school board.
