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1	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-61-532(b), regarding the operation of the		
2	Arkansas Heavy Equipment Operator Training Academy, is amended to read as		
3	follows:		
4	(b) $\underline{(1)}$ The director will report directly to the chancellor regarding		
5	the operation of the academy.		
6	(2) The director shall be appointed by the Chancellor of the		
7	University of Arkansas at Monticello or his or her designee.

9	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-61-533 is amended to read as follows:		
10	6-61-533. Arkansas Heavy Equipment Operator Training Academy - Funding.		
11	(a)(1) All legislatively appropriated funds, tuitions, grant moneys,		
12	and donations designated for the Arkansas Heavy Equipment Operator Training		
13	Academy shall be specifically used for the operation of the academy.		
14	(2) All moneys appropriated or designated for the academy shall		
15	be maintained:		
16	(A) In accounts separate from accounts for the University		
17	of Arkansas at Monticello;		
18	(B) In Bradley County financial institutions whenever		
19	possible; and		
20	(C) Following state accounting procedures and guidelines.		
21	(2) If the General Assembly does not provide funding for the		
22	Arkansas Heavy Equipment Operator Training Academy, the University of		
23	Arkansas at Monticello shall not be required to fund the Academy and the		
24	Academy shall be abolished.

36	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		

1	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the failure of the Arkansas		
2	Heavy Equipment Operator Training Academy as a single-source academy under		
3	the University of Arkansas at Monticello could result in the academy's		
4	inability to finish training its currently enrolled students; and that the		
5	changes in this act are immediately necessary for the continued efficient		
6	operation of the academy. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and		
7	this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public		
8	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
9	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
10	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor		
11	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
12	bill; or		
13	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
14	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
