3	(2) The critical success factors of research institutions are		
4	available research infrastructure, talented senior researchers, suitable		
5	buildings, and effective equipment; and

10	<u>15-3-303.</u> Definitions.		
11	As used in this subchapter:		
12	(1) "Job creating research" means basic and applied laboratory		
13	research that may reasonably be expected to lead to the creation of		
14	knowledge-based and high-technology jobs in Arkansas;		
15	(2) "Knowledge-based and high-technology jobs" means employment		
16	opportunities in positions that pay more than one and seventy-five one		
17	hundredths (1.75) times the average annual wage in the state according to the		
18	most recent data available;		
19	(3) "Research alliance" means the collaborative functions of		
20	research universities for the purpose of:		
21	(A) Enhancing research infrastructure;		
22	(B) Increasing the number of talented researchers at		
23	research universities; and		
24	(C) Expanding knowledge-based and high-technology job-		
25	creating research activities;		
26	(4) "Research infrastructure" means the equipment, buildings,		
27	information technology connectivity, and software of research universities		
28	within which talented researchers conduct their work; and		
29	(5) "Research university" means any university campus in Arkansas		
30	that receives significant federal funding of job-creating research.		
31			
32	15-3-304. Collaboration of Arkansas Science and Technology Authority		
33	with research universities and private business sector representatives.		
34	(a) The Arkansas Science and Technology Authority may work with the		
35	chancellors and presidents of research universities and the private business		
36	sector to support collaborations establishing an alliance for the purpose of		

1	improving the economy of the state through:	
2	(1) Improving research infrastructure;	
3	(2) Increasing the focus on job-creating research activities	
4	within or supported by the research universities; and	
5	(3) Expanding job-creating research activities toward producing	
6	more knowledge-based and high-technology jobs in this state.	
7	(b) The authority shall designate no more than five (5) institutions	
8	of higher education as research universities for the purposes of this	
9	subchapter.	
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11	15-3-305. Areas of collaboration.	
12	The Arkansas Science and Technology Authority may recommend that a	
13	research alliance under this subchapter:	
14	(1) Identify specific areas where scientific research and	
15	technological investigation may contribute to the creation and growth of	
16	knowledge-based and high-technology jobs in Arkansas;	
17	(2) Determine specific areas in which financial investment in	
18	scientific and technological research and development from federal agencies	
19	or private businesses located in Arkansas could be enhanced or increased if	
20	state resources were made available to assist in financing research	
21	infrastructure;	
22	(3) Advise universities of the research needs of Arkansas	
23	businesses and improve the exchange of scientific and technological	
24	information for the mutual benefit of universities and private businesses;	
25	(4) Encourage collaborations among scholars and faculty of	
26	research universities in the areas of research identified by the alliance;	
27	(5)(A) Recommend state investments in research infrastructure.	
28	(B) In determining the recommendations for state	
29	investments in research infrastructure, the alliance shall invite from	
30	research universities:	
31	(i) Assessments of the capabilities of the research	
32	universities to seize research opportunities in the areas of research	
33	identified by the alliance; and	
34	(ii) Investments that would accelerate the creation	
35	of economic opportunities for the citizens of the state;	
36	(6) Certify investments in research infrastructure from the	

1	Arkansas Research Infrastructure Fund; and		
2	(7) Monitor, in the specific areas identified by the alliance:		
3	(A) The growth in university research funding;		
4	(B) Intellectual property creation;		
5	(C) Licensing of technology to entrepreneurial firms and		
6	existing Arkansas companies;		
7	(D) Growth in venture capital investments in Arkansas; and		
8	(E) Employment in knowledge-based and high-technology		
9	employees.		
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11	15-3-306. Contracting with research alliance.		
12	(a) In order to assist a research alliance in achieving the objectives		
13	identified in § 15-3-305, the Arkansas Science and Technology Authority may		
14	contract with a research alliance or any non-profit organization recommended		
15	by a research alliance for activities consistent with the research alliance's		
16	purpose under § 15-3-305		
17	(b) When contracting with the alliance or its designee under this		
18	subchapter, the authority may directly enter into agreements with persons or		
19	entities and shall not be bound by the provisions of Arkansas procurement law		
20	requiring competitive bids.		
21			
22	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 6, Subchapter 4 is amended		
23	to add an additional section to read as follows:		
24	19-6-500. Arkansas Research Infrastructure Fund.		
25	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor		
26	of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a special revenue fund to be		
27	known as the "Arkansas Research Infrastructure Fund".		
28	(b) The fund shall consist of:		
29	(1) All moneys appropriated to it by the General Assembly; and		
30	(2) Any gifts, contributions, grants, or bequests received from		
31	federal, private, or other sources.		
32	(c) The fund shall be used by the Arkansas Science and Technology		
33	Authority for the purposes delineated under the Arkansas Research Alliance		
34	Act, § 15-3-301 et seq.		
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
