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1 law enforcement vehicle and any other vehicle involved in the stop. 2 (2) If changing lanes is not possible or is determined to be unsafe, an approaching motor vehicle operator shall reduce the motor 3 vehicle's speed, proceed with caution, and maintain a reduced speed, 4 appropriate to the road and the conditions, through the area where the 5 6 authorized emergency response vehicle or law enforcement vehicle is stopped. 7 (b)(1)(A) Any party who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to or is 8 found guilty of violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and 9 shall be fined not less than thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) nor more than five 10 hundred dollars (\$500), confined in the county jail not to exceed ninety (90) 11 days, or both fined and imprisoned. 12 (B) In addition to the penalties prescribed in subdivision 13 (b)(1)(A) of this section, the court may order community service for not more 14 than seven (7) days and may suspend the person's driver's license for a 15 period of not less than ninety (90) days nor more than six (6) months. 16 (2) There is created a rebuttable presumption that shall arise 17 in any criminal action under this section to the effect that if it can be proven that a person is the registered owner of a vehicle that is driven in a 18 19 manner which violates this section, the person is presumed to have been the 20 driver of the vehicle at the time of the violation. 21 22 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-36-305 is amended as follows: 2.3 27-36-305. Other emergency vehicles. 24 (a) All state, county, and municipal agencies and private persons and 25 businesses that operate any other type of vehicle in this state that is 26 required or permitted to be equipped with flashing or rotating emergency or 27 warning lights shall equip the vehicles with white or amber flashing or 28 rotating emergency or warning lights only. 29 (b)(1) In addition to amber flashing or rotating emergency or warning 30 lights, wreckers or tow vehicles permitted or licensed under § 27-50-1203 that respond to traffic incidents may, but are not required to, be equipped 31 32 with red flashing or rotating emergency or warning lights in addition to 33 amber warning lights. 34 (2) Red flashing or rotating emergency or warning lights on a

wrecker or tow vehicle shall be operated only at times the wrecker or tow

vehicle is stopped on or within ten feet (10') of a public way and engaged in

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1 recovery or loading and hooking up an abandoned, an unattended, a disabled, 2 or a wrecked vehicle. A wrecker or tow vehicle shall not operate forwardfacing red flashing or rotating emergency or warning lights while underway, 3 4 except as may be expressly authorized by law otherwise. 5 6 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 27-49-219 is amended as follows: 7 27-49-219. Vehicles. 8 (a) "Vehicle" means every device in, upon, or by which any person or 9 property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except devices 10 moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks. 11 (b) "Motor vehicles" means every vehicle which is self-propelled and 12 every vehicle which is propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires but not operated upon rails. 13 "Motorcycle" means every motor vehicle having a saddle for the use 14 15 of the rider and designed to travel on not more than three (3) wheels in 16 contact with the ground but excluding a tractor. 17 (d)(1) "Authorized emergency vehicle" means authorized emergency vehicles which shall include: 18 19 (A) Motor vehicles used by state, county, or city and 20 municipal police agencies, all of which shall be equipped with: 21 (i) Blue; or 22 (ii) Blue, red, or white rotating or flashing 23 emergency lights; 24 (B) Motor vehicles used by state, county, city, or 25 municipal fire departments, motor vehicles owned and used by volunteer fire 26 fighters while engaged in official duties, motor vehicles used by emergency 27 medical technicians certified by the Division of Health of the Department of 28 Health and Human Services or privately owned fire departments, and ambulances 29 used solely for ambulance purposes which are approved as ambulances in 30 accordance with state and federal highway safety standards, all of which 31 shall be equipped with red rotating or flashing emergency lights. Flashing 32 emergency lights shall be used by volunteer fire fighters solely while 33 engaged in the performance of duties as volunteer fire fighters and by 34 emergency medical technicians solely while engaged in the performance of 35 duties with an ambulance service licensed by the division or an organized

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rescue squad or team; and

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                       (C) Motor vehicles owned by state, county, and municipal
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     agencies whose use is determined by the state agency to be required for
     dangerous or hazardous services and motor vehicles owned by public service
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     corporations or private individuals whose use is determined by the
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     Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, in accordance with regulations established by
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     the commissioner to prevent abuses thereof, to be for extra hazardous
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     service, may be equipped with amber flashing or rotating emergency or warning
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     lights which shall not qualify them as emergency vehicles, but which shall,
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     during hazardous uses thereof, display their amber flashing or rotating
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     emergency or warning lights in order that other motorists and the public may
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     be aware of the special or hazardous use of the vehicles and shall exercise
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     caution in approaching the vehicles at all times while the amber flashing or
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     rotating emergency or warning lights are in operation. All hazardous service
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     vehicles shall conform to regular traffic signals and speed limits during
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     their operation.; and
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                       (D)(i) Motor vehicles utilized as wreckers or tow vehicles
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     permitted or licensed under § 27-50-1203 and may be equipped with amber
     flashing or rotating emergency or warning lights that shall not qualify them
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     as emergency vehicles, but which shall, only during hazardous uses thereof,
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     display their amber flashing or rotating emergency or warning lights in order
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     that other motorists and the public may be aware of the special or hazardous
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     use of the wreckers or tow vehicles and exercise caution in approaching the
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     wreckers or tow vehicles at all times while the amber flashing or rotating
     emergency or warning lights are in operation. Unless otherwise directed by a
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     law enforcement officer, a wrecker or tow vehicle shall conform to regular
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     signals and speed limits during its operation. In addition to amber flashing
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     or rotating emergency or warning lights, wreckers or tow vehicles that
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     respond to highway emergencies may be equipped with red flashing or rotating
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     emergency or warning lights; and
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                             (ii) Red flashing or rotating emergency or warning
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     lights on a wrecker or tow vehicle shall be operated only while the wrecker
     or tow vehicle is stopped on or within ten feet (10') of a public way and
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     engaged in recovery or loading and hooking up an abandoned, an unattended, a
     disabled, or a wrecked vehicle. A wrecker or tow vehicle shall not operate
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     forward-facing red flashing or rotating emergency or warning lights while
     underway, except as may be expressly authorized or required by law otherwise.
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1 (2) It shall be unlawful to install, operate, or use any 2 rotating or flashing light on any motor vehicle except as authorized in this subsection. 3 4 (e) "School bus" means every motor vehicle owned by a public or 5 governmental agency and operated for the transportation of children to or 6 from school or privately owned and operated for compensation for the 7 transportation of children to or from school. 8 9 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 27-35-102 is amended as follows: 10 27-35-102. Certain vehicles exempted. 11 (a) The provisions of this subchapter chapter governing size, weight, 12 and load shall not apply to fire apparatus, road machinery, or to implements 13 of husbandry, including farm tractors, temporarily moved upon a highway, or 14 to a vehicle operated under the terms of a special permit issued as provided 15 in this subchapter. 16 (b) The provisions of this chapter relating to height, width, weight, 17 length, and load restrictions for motor vehicles shall not apply to any wrecker or tow vehicle performing a wrecker or towing service, as defined in 18 this section. If a disabled or wrecked vehicle cannot be moved by a wrecker 19 20 or tow vehicle, a rollback or car carrier may be used without regard to such 21 height, width, length, and load restrictions if it holds a valid permit 22 issued by the Arkansas Towing and Recovery Board under § 27-50-1203. 2.3 (c) For purposes of this section, "wrecker or towing service" shall 24 mean the act by a towing business permitted under § 27-50-1203 of transporting, towing, or recovering with a wrecker, tow vehicle, rollback, or 25 26 car carrier any vehicle not owned by the operator of the wrecker, tow 27 vehicle, rollback, or car carrier for which the operator directly or 28 indirectly receives compensation or other personal gain. 29 (d) "Wrecker" or "tow vehicle" means any emergency commercial vehicle 30 equipped, designed, and used to assist or render aid and transport or tow disabled or wrecked vehicles from a highway, road, street, or highway rights-31 32 of-way to a point of storage or repair, including towing a replacement 33 vehicle to replace a disabled or wrecked vehicle. 34 35 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 27-35-107 is amended as follows:

27-35-107. Registration of gross weight.

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- (a)(1) Upon registering any vehicle under the laws of this state,
 which vehicle is designed and used primarily for the transportation of
 property or for the transportation of ten (10) or more persons, the
 Commissioner of Motor Vehicles may require such information and may make such
 investigation or test as necessary to enable him or her to determine whether
 the vehicle may safely be operated upon the highways in compliance with all
- 8 (2) He or she shall register every such vehicle for a 9 permissible gross weight not exceeding the limitation set forth in this 10 chapter.
- 11 (3) Every such vehicle shall be equipped with brakes as required 12 in \$\$ 27-37-501 and 27-37-502.
 - (b)(1) The commissioner shall insert in the registration card issued for every such vehicle the gross weight for which it is registered. If it is a motor vehicle to be used for propelling other vehicles, he or she shall separately insert the total permissible gross weight of that motor vehicle and other vehicles to be propelled by it.
- 18 (2) He or she may also issue a special plate with the gross
 19 weight or weights stated thereon which shall be attached to the vehicle and
 20 displayed at all times.
 - (3) A wrecker or tow vehicle shall be required to register only for the gross weight of that wrecker or tow vehicle without inclusion of the weight of the vehicle being towed by the wrecker or tow vehicle. In the registration card issued for a wrecker or tow vehicle, the commissioner shall only insert the total permissible gross weight of the wrecker or tow vehicle.
 - (c)(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle or combination of vehicles of a gross weight in excess of that for which registered by the commissioner or in excess of the limitations set forth in this chapter.
- 30 (2) In determining the gross weight of a wrecker or tow vehicle,
 31 only the gross weight of the wrecker or tow vehicle shall be considered,
 32 without inclusion of the weight of the vehicle being towed.
- 33 (d) The commissioner shall implement rules and regulations issued by 34 the United States Secretary of Transportation pertaining to federal use tax 35 payments.

I	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 27-14-601(a) is amended by adding an		
2	additional subdivision to read as follows:		
3	(J)(i) The director shall cause to be issued special and		
4	distinctive license plates for vehicles licensed under Class Two through		
5	Class Seven in this section, which are utilized as wreckers or tow vehicles		
6	and that hold a permit issued by the Arkansas Towing and Recovery Board unde		
7	§ 27-50-1203 and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.		
8	(ii) Before any license may be issued for a vehicle		
9	designated as a wrecker or tow vehicle, the applicant shall furnish to the		
10	director a certification from the Arkansas Towing and Recovery Board that the		
11	wrecker or tow vehicle has been permitted as a wrecker or tow vehicle by the		
12	board.		
13	(iii) Beginning January 1, 2008, every wrecker or		
14	tow vehicle permitted by the Arkansas Towing and Recovery Board shall obtain		
15	upon initial registration, or at the time of next renewal, a distinctive		
16	wrecker or tow vehicle license plate.		
17	(iv) In addition to the fee for the respective Class		
18	Two through Class Seven license, the director may assess a handling and		
19	administrative fee in the amount of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each distinctive		
20	wrecker or tow vehicle license plate.		
21	(v) A wrecker or tow vehicle licensed pursuant to		
22	the International Registration Plan may obtain the distinctive wrecker or too		
23	vehicle license plate to be displayed in addition to any license plate held		
24	pursuant to the International Registration Plan.		
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
