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35	SECTION 2. The amendment made by Section 1 of this act shall apply to		
36	all ordinances and orders heretofore adopted or entered under the authority		

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1	of Arkansas Code § 14-164-208. All such ordinances and orders heretofore	
2	adopted or entered shall be considered for all purposes as if adopted or	
3	entered under the authority of this act. No such ordinance heretofore	
4	adopted shall be held to be invalidly adopted by reason of the provision of

7	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
8	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there is an immediate need for	
9	certainty in the procedure for issuance of industrial revenue bonds by	
10	municipalities and counties for the financing of industrial projects for the	
11	purpose of securing and developing industry. Therefore, an emergency is	
12	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the	
13	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective	
14	on:	
15	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;	
16	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,	
17	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the	
18	<pre>bill; or</pre>	
19	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is	
20	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.	
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
