(b)(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, where a claim is by reason of mental injury or illness, the employee shall be limited to twenty-six (26) fifty-two (52) weeks of disability benefits.

(2)(A) In case death results directly from the mental injury or illness within a period of one (1) year from the time compensation was last paid or two (2) years from the date of injury, whichever is longer, compensation shall be paid to the dependents as provided in other death cases under this chapter.

(B) Death directly or indirectly related to the mental injury or illness occurring one (1) year or more from the incident resulting

- in the mental injury or illness shall not be a compensable injury.
