25	any figure not less than ninety (90) during any school year if the admission			
26	of freshmen students in excess of ninety (90) would endanger the accredited			
27	rating of the College of Medicine as determined by the standards of the			
28	Association of American	Medical Colleges.		
29	(2) Wheneve	r the board of trustees at th	e University of Arkansas
