3	State Board of Education.
4	$\frac{(a)(1)}{(b)(1)}$ The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and
5	regulations for the issuance, licensure, relicensure, and continuance of
6	licensure of teachers in the public schools of this state.
7	(2) The State Board of Education shall prescribe uniform college
8	level preparatory and grade point average requirements for all teachers
9	applying for initial licensure or relicensure after July 1, 2007, that are
10	consistent with the recommendations of the Professional Licensure Standards
11	Board prescribing uniform college level preparatory and grade point average
12	requirements for all teachers applying for initial licensure or relicensure
13	after July 1, 2007, including uniform and specific requirements for:
14	(A) Course of study;
15	(B) College level teacher education classes;
16	(C) Subject-matter specific course work certification or
17	licensure in a particular subject area rather than grade level certification;

27	(f) For purposes of this section, "certified teaching license"
28	includes that license of a licensed classroom teacher, administrator,
29	counselor, or librarian.
30	(e)(1) By July 1, 2007, the levels of licensure for Arkansas shall be
31	<pre>for:</pre>
32	(A) Prekindergarten through grade four (PreK-4);
33	(B) Grades four through eight (4-8);
34	(C) Grades seven through twelve (7-12); and
35	(D) Specialty content areas prekindergarten through grade
36	twelve (PreK-12).

T	(2) Upon a teacher's completion of the department's requirements
2	for an additional licensure plan, the State Board of Education may grant an
3	endorsement to the teaching license as follows:

34	standard, and provisional licensure and the renewal of these licenses,
35	subject to the approval of the State Board of Education;
36	(5) Review, evaluate, and recommend assessments for existing and

_	new freehouse areas and recommend minimum performance revers for issuance of
2	a license;
3	(6) Review, evaluate, and recommend requirements of licensure
4	renewal, including professional development;
5	(7) Review, evaluate, and recommend requirements for license
6	reciprocity;
7	(8) Review, evaluate, and recommend requirements for adding
8	licensure areas and endorsements to an existing valid license;
9	(9) Consult with groups whose work may be affected by the
10	Professional Education, Development, Licensure, and Assessment Board's
11	recommendations;
12	(10) Request and review reports from the department concerning
13	licensed personnel and existing or potential shortage areas;
14	(11) Hold public hearings, along with department staff, prior t
15	submitting recommendations concerning professional education, development,
16	licensure, and assessment to the State Board of Education for approval; and
17	(12) Establish subcommittees as necessary to research the trend
18	and impact of issues submitted to the Professional Education, Development,
19	Licensure, and Assessment Board for consideration.
20	(k) The commissioner may present to the State Board of Education as a
21	agenda item any measure that the Professional Education, Development,
22	Licensure, and Assessment Board does not approve, but the State Board of
23	Education shall be put on notice that the measure was not approved for
24	recommendation to the State Board of Education.
25	(1)(1) The department shall provide staff and office space to the
26	Professional Education, Development, Licensure, and Assessment Board.
27	(2)(A) Members of the Professional, Education, Development,
28	Licensure, and Assessment Board shall serve without pay.
29	(B) Members of the Professional, Education, Development,
30	Licensure, and Assessment Board may receive expense reimbursement in
31	accordance with § 25-16-902, to be paid by the department to the extent that
32	money is available.

34	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 17, Subchapter 4 is amended
35	to add an additional section to read as follows:
36	6-17-422. Professional Licensure Standards Board.

1	(a) There is established the Professional Licensure Standards Board.
2	(b) The Professional Licensure Standards Board shall consist of
3	nineteen (19) members appointed by the State Board of Education as follows:
4	(1) The Commissioner of Education, who shall serve as a
5	nonvoting member and chair;
6	(2)(A) Six (6) public school classroom teachers with a valid
7	Arkansas teaching license who are recommended by the Arkansas Education
8	Association.
9	(B) The six (6) public school classroom teachers shall
10	represent the four (4) congressional districts in Arkansas and include:
11	(i) A licensure level of prekindergarten through
12	grade four (PreK-4);
13	(ii) A licensure level of grades four through eight
14	<u>(4-8);</u>
15	(iii) A licensure level of grades seven through
16	twelve (7-12); and
17	(iv) Any licensure level to serve in three (3) at-
18	large positions;
19	(3) Four (4) persons with a valid Arkansas teaching and
20	administrator's license who represent the four (4) congressional districts in
21	Arkansas and are:
22	(A) Recommended by the Arkansas Association of Educational
23	Administrators; and
24	(B) One (1) of whom shall hold a P-8 building level leader
25	license and serve as a middle-level building leader; and
26	(C) Three (3) of whom shall be public school
27	superintendents with a valid Arkansas teaching license recommended by the
28	Arkansas Association of School Administrators;
29	(4) Two (2) public school administrators with a valid Arkansas
30	teaching and administrator's license recommended by the Arkansas Association
31	of School Personnel Administrators;
32	(5) Two (2) nonvoting representatives designated by the
33	Department of Education from its offices of licensure and teacher quality
34	recommended by the commissioner;
35	(6)(A) Two (2) deans of education from Arkansas institutions of
36	higher education recommended by the Arkansas Deans Association.

1	(b) One (1) dean shall be from a private institution of
2	higher education and one (1) dean from a public institution of higher
3	education;
4	(7) One (1) coordinator of educational leadership recommended by
5	the Arkansas Professors of Educational Administration; and
6	(8) One (1) curriculum program administrator recommended by the
7	Arkansas Association of Supervision and Curriculum Development.
8	(c)(1) The State Board of Education shall consider all recommendations
9	under subsection (b) of this section submitted to the secretary of the State
10	Board of Education by June 30, 2007 for the initial board, and by June 30 of
11	each year in which the term of a Professional Licensure Standards Board
12	member expires.
13	(2) If a recommendation for a person qualified to fill a
14	position on the Professional Licensure Standards Board is not received by the
15	deadline, the State Board of Education may appoint any qualified person to
16	fill the position.
17	(d)(l)(A) Each member of the Professional Licensure Standards Board
18	shall serve a term of three (3) years.
19	(B) The initial members shall draw lots for staggered
20	terms.
21	(2) The State Board of Education shall appoint any qualified
22	person to fill a position that is vacated before the expiration of a member's
23	term.
24	(e)(1) The appointed members of the Professional Licensure Standards
25	Board shall be residents of this state at the time of appointment and
26	throughout their terms.
27	(2) The Commissioner of Education or his or her designee shall
28	call an organizational meeting within twenty (20) calendar days after the
29	State Board of Education has made all necessary appointments.
30	(f)(l) The Professional Licensure Standards Board shall meet at times
31	and places the chair deems necessary, but no meetings shall be held outside
32	of this state.
33	(2) A majority of the members of the Professional Licensure
34	Standards Board shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting
35	business.
36	(3) All action of the Professional Licensure Standards Board

1	shall be by a majority vote of the full membership of the Professional
2	Licensure Standards Board.
3	(g)(1) Members of the Professional Licensure Standards Board shall
4	serve without pay.
5	(2) Members of the Professional Licensure Standards Board may
6	receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-902, to be paid by
7	the Department of Education to the extent money is available for that
8	purpose.
9	(h) The Professional Licensure Standards Board shall:
10	(1) Develop and recommend for adoption to the State Board of
11	Education uniform college level preparatory and grade point average
12	requirements for all teachers applying for initial licensure or relicensure
13	after July 1, 2007, that shall include uniform and specific requirements for:
14	(A) Course of study;
15	(B) College level teacher education classes;
16	(C) Subject-matter specific course work certification or
17	licensure in a particular subject area rather than grade-level certification;
18	<u>and</u>
19	(D) In-class teaching internships or practice teaching
20	hours;
21	(2)(A) With the assistance of the Department of Education and
22	the Department of Higher Education, review the audits of the teacher
23	education programs offered by all institutions of higher education in the
24	state to determine if the institutions' teacher education programs and
25	courses of study are aligned as necessary to allow graduates of the teacher
26	education program to become licensed under this act and the rules set by the
27	State Board of Education.
28	(B)(i)(a) To ensure uniformity in university course
29	syllabi for licensure, the Department of Education shall conduct audits of
30	licensure programs of study at all Arkansas institutions of higher education.
31	(b) The audits shall use state and national
32	standards for licensure programs, including without limitation the standards
33	of the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education.
34	(ii) The audits shall be conducted on a five-year
35	cycle beginning on July 1, 2007 and provided to the Professional Licensure
36	Standards Board.

1	(iii)(a) Institutions of higher education that do
2	not comply with the department's audit findings and recommendations shall
3	have one (1) semester to bring programs into compliance with the audit
4	recommendations and submit documentation of compliance to the Professional
5	Licensure Standards Board.
6	(b) If the institution of higher education
7	does not bring its program into compliance with audit recommendations, the
8	Professional Licensure Standards Board shall submit a recommendation to the
9	State Board of Education for discontinuance of the authority of the
10	institution to offer the licensure program; and
11	(3)(A) Establish a code of ethics for administrators,
12	principals, and teachers in educational environments for students in
13	prekindergarten through grade twelve (PreK-12).
14	(B) Upon the approval of the code of ethics, procedures,
15	and recommendations for enforcement required by § 6-17-422(g)(3), the valid
16	Arkansas teaching license of any person shall be subject to the conditions,
17	requirements, and mandates of the code of ethics, procedures, and
18	recommendations for enforcement.
19	(C)(i) The Professional Licensure Standards Board may
20	recommend to the State Board of Education and the State Board of Education
21	may approve the monetary fees to be paid by a person for the issuance,
22	reissuance, fine, or penalty associated with the process, procedures, or
23	enforcement of requirements necessary to issue or maintain an Arkansas
24	teaching license.
25	(ii) Under no circumstances shall any one (1)
26	specific fee or fine exceed one hundred dollars (\$100).
27	(iii) Revenue collected by the State Board of
28	Education from the fees and fines under this subdivision (g)(3)(C) shall be
29	used for the operation of the Professional Licensure Standards Board.
30	(D) The Professional Licensure Standards Board may
31	establish procedures for receiving, considering, and investigating complaints
32	regarding the unethical behavior of licensed school personnel and make
33	recommendations for enforcement.
34	(E) The State Board of Education may allow the
35	Professional Licensure Board to receive, consider, and hear complaints and
36	take recommended action on the teaching license of any person possessing a

1	valid teaching license.
2	
3	SECTION 4. NOT TO BE CODIFIED. By July 1, 2008, the Professional
4	Licensure Standards Board shall submit to the State Board of Education for
5	approval the code of ethics, procedures, and recommendations for enforcement
6	required by § 6-17-422(g)(3).
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
