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20	WHEREAS, Arkansas was the first state to create conservation	distri	cts;
21	and		
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23	WHEREAS, in February, 1937, President Franklin D. Roosevelt i	ssued	а
24	call for all states to establish conservation districts; and		
25			
26	WHEREAS, Governor Carl E. Bailey introduced the President's l	etter	to
27	the Arkansas General Assembly and the General Assembly responded wi	th the	
28	passage of Act 197 of 1937 creating conservation districts to provi	de	
29	leadership and representation at the local level for issues affective	ng	
30	conservation, the protection of the local tax base, and the proper	manage	ment
31	of the natural resources of the State of Arkansas; and

33	WHEREAS, conservation district authority has dissipated in re-	cent y	ears
34	because federal and state agencies have preempted that authority; as	nd	
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36	WHEREAS, as a result of the dissipation of authority of the		

1	conservation districts, a general lack of public awareness of the election
2	process for, the existence of, and the authority of the conservation
3	districts has arisen; and
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5	WHEREAS, the conservation districts continue to be viable and active
6	participants in addressing water qualities issues and problems regarding
7	policies and goals within their respective areas of authority; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, federal, state, and local governments and their designees are
10	initiating planning policies, ecosystem management strategies, and procedures
11	to address resource management across whole watersheds; and
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13	WHEREAS, numerous nongovernmental organizations are using federal and
14	state funds to write watershed management plans and other related plans with
15	the intention of implementing the plans with no local government approval or
16	oversight; and
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18	WHEREAS, watershed boundaries include private property; therefore,
19	authorization for implementation for a coordinated approach to watershed
20	management should be by elected, local officials both to minimize the social,
21	economic, and cultural impact of watershed management plans on local
22	communities and to optimize resource conservation; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, coordination of resource management efforts including efforts
25	on federal lands, state lands, and private property should be led at the
26	local level to accomplish common conservation goals and to eliminate
27	duplication of efforts through a pooling of limited resources; and
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29	WHEREAS, the conservation districts should work together in authorizing
30	and coordinating watershed management plans.

32	NOW THEREFORE,
33	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL
34	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
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THAT the General Assembly recognizes the seventieth anniversary of

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conservation districts, urges renewed vigilance in the protection of private property rights, urges federal agencies, state agencies, and nongovernmental organizations to respect the value and authority of conservation districts, and recognizes that the conservation districts should take the leadership role in authorizing and coordinating watershed management plans.
