28	WHEREAS, under Arkansas law, a school district experiencing growth in
29	its average daily membership may receive \$5,400 per pupil for the increase,
30	if any, in average daily membership over the previous year's average daily
31	membership, as calculated in Arkansas Code § 6-20-2303(19); and

33	WHEREAS, the Lake View plaintiff school districts have asserted that a
34	school district experiencing a growth in its average daily membership may not
35	receive an adequate amount of funding based on that method of calculating
36	growth funding; and

1 2 WHEREAS, the General Assembly needs additional information as to what 3 costs a school district experiences when it's average daily membership 4 increases, what factors influence those costs, and at what point those costs 5 exceed the \$5,400 currently provided, 6 7 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL 8 9 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 10 11 THAT the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education conduct a 12 study in the upcoming biennium to recommend the actual per-student funding 13 amount needed to meet average daily membership growth needs. The study 14 should: 15 (a) Determine the amount of funding change, if any, in the operations 16 and maintenance component of the matrix to account for efficiency; 17 (b) Identify whether and to what degree other components of the foundation funding matrix may need to be changed; 18 19 (c) Assess student mobility from district to district within the state; and 20 21 (d) Review what level of student growth may necessitate a need for 22 additional funding. 23 24 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the House and Senate Interim Committees on 25 Education prepare a report detailing the results of the study on or before 26 May 1, 2008. 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36
