16	WHEREAS, Mr. Michael Lynn Mashburn of Little Rock, Arkansas, died on
17	October 18, 2005, at the age of forty-five (45) years; and

19	WHEREAS, at the time of death, Michael Mashburn was employed in the
20	heavy equipment transportation industry and, unfortunately, died while
21	honorably performing the job that provided for him and his family; and

23	WHEREAS, the family and friends of Michael Mashburn mourn his loss and
24	will forever remember his life as being suddenly and unexpectedly taken in
25	the prime of his life; and

27	WHEREAS, the brother of Michael Mashburn, James Mashburn, has, in the
28 29	face of personal tragedy caused by the loss of his beloved brother, worked tirelessly at the local, state, and federal level to address the issues of
30	occupational safety that surround the death of Michael Mashburn; and
31	occupational safety that suffound the death of Michael Mashburn, and
32	WHEREAS, the occupational safety issues related to Michael Mashburn's
33	death on which James Mashburn is working include the improvement of the
34	safety of road construction sites and the overall compliance of contractors
35	and employers with the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health
36	Administration (OSHA) regulations; and

WHEREAS, the three (3) primary safety concerns that James Mashburn has identified as needing to be addressed when heavy equipment is unloaded at road construction sites to prevent another family from losing a loved one under similar tragic circumstances are the use of wooden supports, mats, or floaters; the improper use of cranes; the training of employees in first aid procedures if the employee is involved in the unloading of heavy equipment; and the availability of medical equipment at the job sites; and WHEREAS, the House of the Eighty-Sixth General Assembly wishes to publicly remember Mr. Michael Lynn Mashburn, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the individual members of the House of Representatives hereby express sincere condolences to the family of Mr. Michael Lynn Mashburn and recognize the tireless efforts of his brother, James Mashburn, to improve job site safety, and upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate copy shall be provided to the family of Mr. Mashburn by the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives.
