20	WHEREAS, John William "Bill" Murphy was born on January 22, 1925, at
21	the Fayetteville City Hospital to Everett and Leta Taylor Murphy, and he died
22	in Fayetteville, Arkansas, on January 31, 2006; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, Mr. Murphy attended Washington Elementary School and
25	Fayetteville High School, graduating in 1942; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, Mr. Murphy enlisted in the Marine Corps at the age of
28	seventeen (17) and served with the 2nd Marine Raider Battalion and was
29	wounded during the invasion of Guam in the fall of 1944; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, Mr. Murphy received the Military Order of the Purple Heart,
32	the Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal, and the World War II Victory Medal; and

34	WHEREAS, Mr. Murphy graduated from the University of Arkansas with a
35	law degree in 1950, and was a practicing attorney in Fayetteville for more
36	than fifty (50) years; and

2	WHEREAS, Mr. Murphy was actively involved with the Shriners, Elks,
3	Jaycees, Masons, Veterans Administration, Disabled American Veterans, Purple
4	Heart Society, the Marine Raider Association, the Fayetteville National
5	Cemetery, and the American Legion of Arkansas; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, Mr. Murphy served as State Commander of the American Legion of
8	Arkansas in 1972 and served as National Vice Commander in 1993; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, Mr. Murphy was elected from Washington County to the Arkansas
11	House of Representatives in 1951 and served two (2) terms; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, over the years, Mr. Murphy received several appointments by
14	the governors of Arkansas, including Chairman of the Governor's Commission of
15	Veteran Affairs; and he was appointed by President William J. Clinton to
16	serve as a member of the World War II Advisory Board, which was responsible
17	for the design of the World War II Memorial,

19	NOW THEREFORE,
20	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL
21	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23	THAT the House of Representatives honors the memory of Mr. John William
24	"Bill" Murphy, celebrates his life and significant contributions to the
25	Arkansas Bar, the Arkansas House of Representatives, and his community,
26	state, and nation, and remembers him with the deepest admiration.

29	Representatives hereby express sincere condolences to the family of Mr.
30	Murphy, and upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate copy shall be
