## Subtitle

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15 AN ACT FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF  
16 THE COURTS APPROPRIATION FOR COURT  
17 SECURITY FOR THE 2007-2009 BIENNIUM.  
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. COURT SECURITY. There is hereby established  
24 for the Administrative Office of the Courts for the 2007-2009 biennium, the  
25 following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be  
26 governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act  
27 (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory  
28 thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum  
29 annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the  
30 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons  
31 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions  
32 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-  
33 101), or its successor.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - SECURITY GRANTS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Administrative Office of the Courts, to be payable from the State Central Services Fund, for personal services and grants to city and county governments to implement local security and emergency preparedness plans for circuit and district courts by the Administrative Office of the Courts for the biennial period ending June 30, 2009, the following:

SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or

1 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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3 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
4 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
5 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the  
6 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of  
7 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
8 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
9 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the  
10 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
11 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
12 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
13 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
