The member shall be appointed by the Governor from the state at large and be subject to confirmation by the Senate; (14) One (1) member shall be a licensed doctor of podiatric medicine of good professional standing who has at least seven (7) years' experience in the practice of the profession in this state. The member shall be appointed from a list of not fewer than three (3) names presented by the Arkansas Podiatric Medical Association; (15) One (1) member shall be a member of the Arkansas Public Health Association.
