23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

25 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 4, Chapter 110, is amended to add an
26 additional subchapter to read as follows:

27 4-110-201. Title.

28 This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "RFID Right to
29 Know Act".

31 4-110-202. Definitions.

32 As used in this subchapter:

33 (1) "Radio frequency identification" or "RFID" means a
34 technology that uses radio waves to automatically identify an individual item
35 or person;

36 (2) "Tag" means a microchip that is attached to an antenna that



1 is able to transmit identification information using RFID.

3 4-110-203. Consumer notice required.

4 A retailer shall provide a consumer with written notice of the presence
5 of an RFID tag on the labeling or packaging of a product that:

6 (1) Contains an RFID tag; and

7 (2) Is available for purchase at the retailer's place of
8 business.
