28	be necessary after prompt screening by the Community Mental Health Center.
29	Payment for patients screened and approved by the Community Mental Health

The Division of Behavioral Health Services shall develop an evaluation and monitoring program that will assure all expenditures are made 10 11 consistent with the intent of these appropriations. As a condition for 12 receiving funds under this Act, Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) shall report quarterly to the Division of Behavioral Health Services the following 13 14 data: 15 (1) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions 16 referred by CMHCs to community-based settings; 17 (2) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions to community-based settings receiving assistance from the acute mental health 18 19 services funds; (3) the total number of acute bed days utilized by these involuntary 20 21 commitments; 22 (4) the total number of bed days utilized by these medically indigent 23 admissions; 24 (5) the average length of stay of admissions for these involuntary 25 commitments per catchment area; 26 (6) the average length of stay of admissions for these medically indigent 27 admissions per catchment area; 28 (7) the number of medically indigent admissions per catchment area unable to 29 receive assistance from the acute mental health services funds due to such 30 funds being depleted by prior admissions; (8) the number of re-admissions per catchment area for involuntary 31 32 commitments and medically indigent admissions to community-based settings 33 receiving assistance from the acute mental health services; and 34 (9) identify any steps taken by CMHCs to improve access to acute mental 35 health services.

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1 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE 2 MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - PER CAPITA - LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. 3 The 4 General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of 5 mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago 6 and has taken various approaches to funding since then. The General Assembly 7 also recognizes that there are inherent problems within the current public 8 mental health system that create disincentives for proper treatment and care. 9 The purpose of the Acute Mental Health Services - Per Capita appropriation is 10 to provide an appropriation for acute mental health services to be utilized 11 within community-based settings for the treatment and care of medically 12 indigent persons 18 years of age and older and involuntary commitments to the public mental health system. The appropriation for acute mental health 13 14 services provided in this Act shall only be used for Community Mental Health 15 Centers licensed and certified by the Division of Behavioral Health of the 16 Department of Health and Human Services for use within community-based 17 settings and facilities.

21	restrictive settings. The state has designated the community-based behavioral
22	health services and their contracted non-profit provider network as quasi-
23	governmental instrumentalities of the state and utilized them to provide an
24	array of treatment, care and support services to the behavioral health
25	services in a community environment.

SECTION 32. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 6 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 7 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 8 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 9 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 10 11 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 12 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 13 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

15 SECTION 33. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 16 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 17 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 18 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 19 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 20 21 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 22 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

24 SECTION 34. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 25 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 26 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 27 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of 28 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 29 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 30 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 31 32 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 33 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007. 34 35
