Personnel employed 27 in areas providing critical support and care to Patient Units at the Arkansas 28 State Hospital and Arkansas Health Center during evening and night shifts 29 shall be eligible to receive up to twenty percent (20%) of the hourly rate 30 paid as a shift differential. Personnel required to provide critical and 31 support care to client units during weekend hours shall be eligible to 32 receive up to twenty percent (20%) of the hourly rate paid as a weekend 33 differential. When facilities use shifts other than traditional eight-hour 34 shifts, shift differential may be paid for those shifts exceeding the normal 35 day shift of the facility. When shift and weekend differentials are provided

1	maximum annual rate for the assigned pay grade for those positions included
2	<u>in this Act.</u>
3	
4	The Agency shall identify the shift(s) and job classifications applicable for
5	the differential and the shift differential percentage for which each
6	classification is eligible within each shift. The shift schedule, job
7	classification listing the job titles and the percentage of shift
8	differential for which the job titles will be eligible shall be submitted to
9	the Office of Personnel Management for approval by the Chief Fiscal Officer
10	of the State. Subsequent changes to the shift schedule, job classifications
11	and shift differential percentages must receive prior approval by the Chief
12	Fiscal Officer of the State.
13	
14	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
15	through June 30, 2009.
16	
17	SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
18	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
19	BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. Each Community Mental
20	Health Center shall contract with one or more facilities of its choice
21	(excluding Arkansas State Hospital) to provide the inpatient care for
22	indigent patients which the Community Mental Health Center has determined to
23	be necessary after prompt screening by the Community Mental Health Center.
24	Payment for patients screened and approved by the Community Mental Health
25	Center who receive care at these inpatient facilities shall be provided to
26	the inpatient facilities at the contract rate unless the funds available for
27	this purpose have been exhausted. Available funding as determined by the
28	Director of the Department of <u>Health and</u> Human Services shall be apportioned
29	on a per capita basis up to a maximum of three dollars and forty-eight cents
30	(\$3.48) per capita for fiscal year <del>2005-2006</del> <u>2007-2008</u> and three dollars and
31	forty-eight cents (\$3.48) per capita for fiscal year <del>2006-2007</del> <u>2008-2009</u> .
32	The 2000 federal population census shall be used in determining the
33	population of each catchment area of the fifteen Community Mental Health
34	Centers. All amounts appropriated under this section shall be used by
35	Community Mental Health Centers for residents of each center's catchment area
36	and such funds shall only be accessed as the payment of last resort.

1	
2	SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
3	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
4	REPORTING. The Division of Behavioral Health Services shall develop an
5	evaluation and monitoring program that will assure all expenditures are made
6	consistent with the intent of these appropriations. As a condition for
7	receiving funds under this Act, Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) shall
8	report quarterly to the Division of Behavioral Health Services the following
9	data:
10	(1) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions
11	referred by CMHCs to community-based settings;
12	(2) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions
13	to community-based settings receiving assistance from the acute mental health
14	services funds;
15	(3) the total number of acute bed days utilized by these involuntary
16	commitments;
17	(4) the total number of bed days utilized by these medically indigent
18	admissions;
19	(5) the average length of stay of admissions for these involuntary
20	commitments per catchment area;
21	(6) the average length of stay of admissions for these medically indigent
22	admissions per catchment area;
23	(7) the number of medically indigent admissions per catchment area unable to
24	receive assistance from the acute mental health services funds due to such
25	funds being depleted by prior admissions;
26	(8) the number of re-admissions per catchment area for involuntary
27	commitments and medically indigent admissions to community-based settings
28	receiving assistance from the acute mental health services; and
29	(9) identify any steps taken by CMHCs to improve access to acute mental
30	health services.
31	
32	SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
33	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE
34	MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - PER CAPITA - LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. The
35	General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of
36	mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago

1 and has taken various approaches to funding since then. The General Assembly 2 also recognizes that there are inherent problems within the current public mental health system that create disincentives for proper treatment and care. 3 4 The purpose of the Acute Mental Health Services - Per Capita appropriation is 5 to provide an appropriation for acute mental health services to be utilized 6 within community-based settings for the treatment and care of medically 7 indigent persons 18 years of age and older and involuntary commitments to the 8 public mental health system. The appropriation for acute mental health 9 services provided in this Act shall only be used for Community Mental Health 10 Centers licensed and certified by the Division of Behavioral Health of the 11 Department of Health and Human Services for use within community-based 12 settings and facilities. 13 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 14 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COMMUNITY 16 ALCOHOL SAFETY CARRY FORWARD. Such Community Alcohol Safety appropriation as 17 is authorized in this Act which remains at the end of the first fiscal year of the biennium may be carried forward into the second fiscal year of the 18 19 biennium there to be used for the same purposes. 20 21 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of appropriation and/or funding as 22 authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions: 23 24 (1) Prior to June 30, 2008 the Agency shall by written statement set forth 25 its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said appropriation and/or funding 26 to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget; 27 28 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall 29 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward from 30 the first fiscal year of the biennium to the second fiscal year of the biennium by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 31 32 Committee meeting in the second fiscal year of the biennial period which 33 report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the appropriation and/or funding carried forward from the 34 35 first fiscal year to the second fiscal year, the program name or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the written request 36

1	set forth in (1) above;
2	
3	(3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written
4	report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
5	containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written
6	statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for
7	which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30)
8	days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents
9	its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget
10	Committee; and
11	
12	(4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include all
13	information obtained in item (3) above in the biennial budget manuals and/or
14	a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or
15	Institution.
16	
17	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $2005$
18	<u>2007</u> through June 30, <del>2007</del> <u>2009</u> .
19	
20	SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
22	BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - PROCEEDS FOR SALES OF TIMBER AND HAY - CAPITAL
23	IMPROVEMENTS AND EQUIPMENT. The Division of Behavioral Health Services is
24	authorized to use administrative operating account for capital improvements
25	to the physical plant, and for the purchase of capital equipment, and for the
26	operation of the Arkansas Health Center, operated by the Department of Health
27	and Human Services, Division of Behavioral Health Services. The funds shall
28	be held by the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of
29	Behavioral Health Services, from the proceeds of the sale of timber and hay
30	that may be harvested from land owned by the Division of Behavioral Health
31	Services. All funds deposited and all expenses shall be tracked separately.
32	The harvesting of timber and hay is specifically authorized to provide funds
33	to finance capital improvements to the physical plant, for the purchase of
34	major capital equipment, and for the operation of the Arkansas Health Center.
35	The Division of Behavioral Health Services shall report all income derived
36	from the sale of timber and hay to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and

1	the Legislative Council. Any contracts initiated for the harvesting of
2	timber and hay shall be submitted to the Review Subcommittee of the Arkansas
3	Legislative Council for prior review. All expenditures of funds derived from
4	the sale of timber and hay will be expended in accordance with relevant state
5	purchasing laws.
6	
7	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
8	through June 30, 2009.
9	
10	SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
11	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. <u>ACUTE</u>
12	MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES EMERGENCY RESERVE FUND. Of the total amount
13	appropriated each fiscal year in Section 9 of this Act for Acute Mental
14	Health Services - Per Capita, two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)
15	each fiscal year shall first be placed in an Acute Care Emergency Reserve
16	Fund, administered by the Division of Behavioral Health Services, distributed
17	only to community mental health centers for the payment to community-based
18	hospitals for bed days in instances when the community mental health centers
19	have exhausted their regular appropriation of acute care funds during the
20	fiscal year. The remaining five million five hundred ninety-seven thousand
21	seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$5,597,750) appropriated for fiscal year
22	2008 and the remaining five million six hundred ninety-seven thousand one
23	hundred sixty-two dollars (\$5,697,162) appropriated for fiscal year 2009
24	shall be allocated and made available to the community mental health centers
25	within community-based settings on a per-capita basis. The Division of
26	Behavioral Health Services shall report its plan for the administration of
27	the Acute Care Emergency Reserve Fund to the Arkansas Legislative Council
28	prior to the beginning of the state fiscal year in which the funds are
29	distributed.
30	The Division of Behavioral Health Services shall work with community
31	mental health centers to secure additional funds to be dedicated to the Acute
32	Care Emergency Reserve Fund. The Division of Behavioral Health Services shall
33	report to the Arkansas Legislative Council the amount and source of any such
34	additional funds secured.
35	
36	SECTION 31. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized

1 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 2 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 3 4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 6 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 7 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

10 SECTION 32. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 11 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 12 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 13 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 14 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 15 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 16 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 17 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

19 SECTION 33. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 21 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of 22 23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 24 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the 25 26 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 27 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 28 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 29 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007. 30 31 */s/ Joint Budget Committee* 32 33
