SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 14 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 16 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - VOCATIONAL TRAINEES. The Division of Behavioral 17 Health Services of the Department of Health and Human Services is hereby authorized during the 2005-2007 2007-2009 biennium to provide employment 18 19 opportunities for some of the working residents who are separate from the currently authorized regular vocational trainee positions. The positions 20 21 authorized herein shall not be incorporated into the present classification 22 system but shall be provided for by each Community Mental Health Center, or 23 State Hospital, on a cash account basis. It is the intent of the General 24 Assembly that the authorization of these positions shall facilitate the 25 Agency's ability to provide for residents who are not part of a regular 26 vocational training program. 27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 28 2007 through June 30, 2007 2009. 29 30 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 31 32 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - JOB SHARE. The Division of Behavioral Health

33 Services can utilize job share for positions within the nursing

34 classification (RN, LPN/LPTN, MHW/CNA) for up to 24 hours per week per 35 individual. This will allow the Division to offer weekend option shifts to 36 nursing personnel without increasing the number of positions.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
 2007 through June 30, 2007 2009.

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SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 6 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - STATE HOSPITAL CONTINGENCY POSITIONS. If the 7 Department of Health and Human Services determines, and after prior review by 8 the Legislative Council, it shall be determined that it is in the best 9 interest of the State of Arkansas to discontinue a management contract with a 10 private provider and it is deemed necessary to utilize Department staff to 11 provide the required services, the Director of the Department of Health and 12 Human Services may request the Department of Finance and Administration to approve the establishment of one or more additional positions at salary rates 13 14 not to exceed the maximum salaries established for comparable positions in 15 the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, the Department of Health and 16 Human Services' Appropriation Act, and the University of Arkansas for Medical 17 Sciences' Appropriation Act. Upon approval by the Department of Finance and 18 Administration and after review by the Legislative Council, the Department of 19 Health and Human Services, Division of Behavioral Health Services may 20 establish such positions.

If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as established herein during the next biennium, the position(s) must be requested as a new position(s) in the agencies biennial budget request. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 2007 through June 30, 2007 2009.

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27 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS 29 HEALTH CENTER. (A) The Department of <u>Health and</u> Human Services shall not 30 close the Arkansas Health Center that provides skilled nursing through 31 specialized services and programs.

32 (B) The Department of <u>Health and</u> Human Services shall continue to accept
33 clients for whom it has determined that skilled nursing and specialized
34 services are needed at the Arkansas Health Center.

35 (C) No funds shall be transferred or reduced from the Arkansas Health36 Center, except for use as federal matching funds, below the approved funding

level on March 1, 2003 without the prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative
 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

(D) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue 3 4 funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General 5 Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the 6 appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations 7 authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue 8 Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the 9 Department of Health and Human Services may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Health and Human Services 10 11 authorizing broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary 12 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring 13 prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as 14 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative 15 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. 16 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 17 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void. 18

22 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA 23 24 HELP - BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES. Employees in extra-help positions at the 25 Department of Health and Human Services - Behavioral Health Division may 26 receive an amount not to exceed eighty-five percent (85%) of the maximum 27 annual salary for a comparable position as authorized under § 21-5-201 et 28 seq. during any fiscal year, nor shall such an employee be employed for a 29 period of time to exceed one thousand eight hundred (1800) hours in any 30 single fiscal year.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 2007
32 through June 30, 2007 2009.

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34 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. <u>SPECIAL</u>
 36 PROVISIONS FOR SHIFT DIFFERENTIAL AND WEEKEND PAY FOR <u>PERSONNEL AT HUMAN</u>

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1	DEVELOPMENT CENTERS. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SHIFT DIFFERENTIAL. Personnel employed
2	in areas providing critical support and care to Patient Units at the Arkansas
3	State Hospital and Arkansas Health Center during evening and night shifts
4	shall be eligible to receive up to twenty percent (20%) of the hourly rate
5	paid as a shift differential. Personnel required to provide critical and
6	support care to client units during weekend hours shall be eligible to
7	receive up to twenty percent (20%) of the hourly rate paid as a weekend
8	differential. When facilities use shifts other than traditional eight-hour
9	shifts, shift differential may be paid for those shifts exceeding the normal
10	day shift of the facility. When shift and weekend differentials are provided
11	to employees as herein described, the total compensation may exceed the
12	maximum annual rate for the assigned pay grade for those positions included
13	<u>in this Act.</u>
14	
15	The Agency shall identify the shift(s) and job classifications applicable for
16	the differential and the shift differential percentage for which each

30	BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. Each Community Mental
31	Health Center shall contract with one or more facilities of its choice
32	(excluding Arkansas State Hospital) to provide the inpatient care for
33	indigent patients which the Community Mental Health Center has determined to
34	be necessary after prompt screening by the Community Mental Health Center.
35	Payment for patients screened and approved by the Community Mental Health

36 Center who receive care at these inpatient facilities shall be provided to

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the inpatient facilities at the contract rate unless the funds available for this purpose have been exhausted. Available funding as determined by the Director of the Department of <u>Health and</u> Human Services shall be apportioned on a per capita basis up to a maximum of three dollars and forty-eight cents (\$3.48) per capita for fiscal year 2005-2006 2007-2008 and three dollars and forty-eight cents (\$3.48) per capita for fiscal year 2006-2007 2008-2009. All amounts appropriated under this section shall be used by 10 Community Mental Health Centers for residents of each center's catchment area 11 and such funds shall only be accessed as the payment of last resort. 12

13 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 14 15 REPORTING. The Division of Behavioral Health Services shall develop an 16 evaluation and monitoring program that will assure all expenditures are made 17 consistent with the intent of these appropriations. As a condition for receiving funds under this Act, Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) shall 18 19 report quarterly to the Division of Behavioral Health Services the following 20 data:

21 (1) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions 22 referred by CMHCs to community-based settings;

(2) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions
to community-based settings receiving assistance from the acute mental health

34 (7) the number of medically indigent admissions per catchment area unable to
35 receive assistance from the acute mental health services funds due to such
36 funds being depleted by prior admissions;

(8) the number of re-admissions per catchment area for involuntary
 commitments and medically indigent admissions to community-based settings
 receiving assistance from the acute mental health services; and
 (9) identify any steps taken by CMHCs to improve access to acute mental
 health services.

7 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE 9 MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - PER CAPITA - LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. The 10 General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of 11 mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago 12 and has taken various approaches to funding since then. The General Assembly also recognizes that there are inherent problems within the current public 13 14 mental health system that create disincentives for proper treatment and care. 15 The purpose of the Acute Mental Health Services - Per Capita appropriation is 16 to provide an appropriation for acute mental health services to be utilized 17 within community-based settings for the treatment and care of medically indigent persons 18 years of age and older and involuntary commitments to the 18 19 public mental health system. The appropriation for acute mental health services provided in this Act shall only be used for Community Mental Health 20 21 Centers licensed and certified by the Division of Behavioral Health of the 22 Department of Health and Human Services for use within community-based 23 settings and facilities.

25 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COMMUNITY 27 ALCOHOL SAFETY CARRY FORWARD. Such Community Alcohol Safety appropriation as 28 is authorized in this Act which remains at the end of the first fiscal year 29 of the biennium may be carried forward into the second fiscal year of the 30 biennium there to be used for the same purposes.

11	the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the written request
12	set forth in (1) above;

14	(3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written

17	statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for
18	which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30)

33	BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - PROCEEDS FOR SALES OF TIMBER AND HAY - CAPITAL
34	IMPROVEMENTS AND EQUIPMENT. The Division of Behavioral Health Services is
35	authorized to use administrative operating account for capital improvements
36	to the physical plant, and for the purchase of capital equipment, and for the

1	operation of the Arkansas Health Center, operated by the Department of Health
2	and Human Services, Division of Behavioral Health Services. The funds shall
3	be held by the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of
4	Behavioral Health Services, from the proceeds of the sale of timber and hay
5	that may be harvested from land owned by the Division of Behavioral Health
6	Services. All funds deposited and all expenses shall be tracked separately.
7	The harvesting of timber and hay is specifically authorized to provide funds
8	to finance capital improvements to the physical plant, for the purchase of

22	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. <u>ACUTE</u>
23	MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES EMERGENCY RESERVE FUND. Of the total amount
24	appropriated each fiscal year in Section 9 of this Act for Acute Mental
25	Health Services - Per Capita, two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)
26	each fiscal year shall first be allocated and made available to the Little
27	Rock Community Mental Health Center for Acute Mental Health Services. The
28	remaining five million five hundred thousand dollars (\$5,500,000)
29	appropriated each fiscal year shall be allocated and made available to the
30	community mental health centers within community-based settings on a per-
31	capita basis. The Division of Behavioral Health shall work with the community

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SECTION 32. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 3 4 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 5 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 6 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 7 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 8 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 9 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 10 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 11 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

13 SECTION 33. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 14 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 15 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 16 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 17 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 18 19 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 20 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

22 SECTION 34. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 23 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 24 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of 25 26 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 27 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the 28 29 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 30 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 31 32 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007. 33 34 /s/ Joint Budget Committee 35

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
