8	the State, or both, allocated for the Grants to Community Providers line item
9	program at the end of a fiscal year shall remain in the Developmental
10	Disabilities Services Fund Account or the paying account as determined by the
11	Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, or both, and made available in the
12	following fiscal year for the same purposes to satisfy such legal and
13	contractual obligations that have been entered into prior to the end of the
14	fiscal year.
15	
16	Any carry forward of unexpended balance of appropriation and/or funding as
17	authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:
18	
19	(1) Prior to June 30, 2008 the Agency shall by written statement set forth
20	its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said appropriation and/or funding
21	to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;
22	
23	(2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall
24	report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward from
25	the first fiscal year of the biennium to the second fiscal year of the
26	biennium by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget
27	Committee meeting in the second fiscal year of the biennial period which
28	report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution
29	and the amount of the appropriation and/or funding carried forward from the
30	first fiscal year to the second fiscal year, the program name or line item,
31	the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the written request
32	set forth in (1) above;
33	
34	(3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written
35	report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
36	containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written

1	statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for
2	which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30)
3	days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents
4	its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget
5	Committee; and
6	
7	(4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include
8	all information obtained in item (3) above in the biennial budget manuals
9	and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or
10	Institution.
11	
12	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
13	through June 30, 2009.
14	
15	SECTION 21. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
16	by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
17	made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
18	restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
19	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
20	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
21	control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
22	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
23	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.
24	
25	SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
26	that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
27	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
28	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
29	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
30	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
31	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
32	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
33	
34	SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
35	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
36	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the

1	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
2	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
3	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
4	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
5	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
6	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
7	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
8	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
