No more than two years prior 17 to making any changes to the current pharmaceutical dispensing fee, the State shall conduct an independent survey utilizing generally accepted accounting 18 19 principles, to determine the cost of dispensing a prescription by pharmacists in Arkansas. Only factors relative to the cost of dispensing shall be 20 21 surveyed. These factors shall not include actual acquisition costs or average 22 profit or any combination of actual acquisition costs or average profit. The 23 survey results shall be the basis for establishing the dispensing fee paid to 24 participating pharmacies in the Medicaid prescription drug program in 25 accordance with Federal requirements. 32 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MEDICAL 34 SERVICES GENERAL MEDICAID RATE METHODOLOGY PROVISIONS. (a) Rates established 35 by the Division of Medical Services for the services or programs covered by 36 this Act shall be calculated by the methodologies approved by the Centers for

1 Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). The Division of Medical Services shall 2 have the authority to reduce or increase rates based on the approved methodology. Further, the Division of Medical Services shall have the 3 4 authority to increase or decrease rates for good cause including, but not 5 limited to: (1) identification of provider(s) who can render needed services 6 of equal quality at rates less than traditionally charged and who meet the 7 applicable federal and state laws, rules and regulations pertaining to the 8 provision of a particular service, (2) identification that a provider or 9 group of providers has consistently charged rates to the Arkansas Medicaid 10 Program greater than to other purchasers of medical services of similar size, 11 (3) the Division determines that there has been significant changes in the 12 technology or process by which services are provided by a provider or group of providers which has affected the costs of providing services, or (4) a 13 14 severe economic downturn in the Arkansas economy which has affected the 15 overall state budget of the Division of Medical Services. 16 The Division of Medical Services shall make available to requesting 17 providers, the CMS's inflationary forecasts (CMS Market Basket Index). Rates established with cost of living increases based on the CMS Market Basket 18 19 Index or other indices will be adjusted annually except when the state budget does not provide sufficient appropriation and funding to affect the change or 20 21 portion thereof. 22 (b) Any rate methodology changes proposed by the Division of Medical Services 23 both of a general and specific nature, shall be subject to prior review by 24 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 26 2007 through June 30, 2007 2009. 27

28 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 30 USAGE AUTHORIZED. The Arkansas Children's Hospital may request the Department of Health and Human Services - Division of Medical Services to 31 32 retain in the Department of Human Services Grant Fund account an amount not 33 to exceed \$2,100,000 each fiscal year from funds made available by this Act 34 for the Child and Family Life Institute, Section 4, item number 06 to be used 35 to match federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas 36 Children's Hospital. These retained funds shall not be recovered for transfer

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1 to the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund.

3 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STATE 5 PLAN. The State Plan must include the provision of EPSDT services as those 6 services are defined in §1396d(r). See §§ 1396a(a)(10)(A), 1396d(a)(4)(B); 7 see also 1396a(a)(43). Section 1396d(r) lists in detail the screening 8 services, vision services, dental services, and hearing services that the 9 State Plan must expressly include, but with regard to treatment services, it 10 states that EPSDT means "[s]uch other necessary health care, diagnostic 11 services, treatment, and other measures described in subsection (a) of this 12 section to correct or ameliorate defects and physical and mental illnesses and conditions discovered by the screening services, whether or not such 13 14 services are covered under the State plan." 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(r)(5) (emphasis 15 added). Reading §1396a, § 1396d(a), and § 1396d(r) together, we believe that 16 the State Plan need not specifically list every treatment service conceivably 17 available under the EPSDT mandate.

The State Plan, however, must pay part or all of the cost of treatments to 18 19 ameliorate conditions discovered by the screening process when those treatments meet. The definitions set forth in § 1396a. See § 1396d(r)(5); 20 see also §§ 1396a(a)(10), 1396a (a)(43), and 1396d(a)(4)(B). The Arkansas 21 22 State Plan states that the "State will provide other health care described in 23 [42 U.S.C. 1396d(a)] that is found to be medically necessary to correct or 24 ameliorate defects and physical and mental illnesses and conditions 25 discovered by the screening services, even when such health care is not otherwise covered under the State Plan." See State Plan Under Title XIX of 26 27 the Social Security Act Medical Assistance Program, State Of Arkansas at § 28 4.b. This provision Meets the EPSDT mandate of the Medicaid Act. 29 We affirm the district court's decision to the extent that it holds that a 30 Medicaid-Eligible individual has a federal right to early intervention day 31 treatment when a physician recommends such treatment. Section 1396d(r)(5)32 states that EPSDT includes any treatments or measures outlined in § 1396d(a). 33 There are twenty-seven sub-parts to § 1396d(a), and we find that sub-part 34 (a)(13), in particular, when read with the other sections of the Medicaid Act listed above, mandates that early intervention day treatment be provided when 35 it is prescribed by a physician. See 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(a)(13) (defining 36

1 medical assistance reimbursable by Medicaid as "other diagnostic, screening, 2 preventive, and rehabilitative services, including any medical or remedial services recommended by a physician...for the maximum reduction of physical 3 4 and mental disability and restoration of an individual to the best possible 5 functional level"). Therefore, after CHMS clinic staff perform a diagnostic 6 evaluation of an eligible child, if the CHMS physician prescribes early 7 intervention day treatment as a service that would lead to the maximum 8 reduction of medical and physical disabilities and restoration of the child 9 to his or her best possible functional level, the Arkansas State Plan must 10 reimburse the treatment. Because CHMS clinics are the only providers of 11 early intervention day treatment, Arkansas must reimburse those clinics. 12

13 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING 14 15 TRANSFERS. (1) Effective July 1, 2007, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State 16 shall transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and 17 Auditor of the State the balance in the Department of Human Services Grants Fund Account solely from monies generated by the additional tax imposed by 18 19 Arkansas Code 26-57-1102 to the University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund. (2) Effective July 1, 2007, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall 20 transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and Auditor of 21 22 the State the sum of one million and fifty thousand dollars (\$1,050,000) from 23 the Arkansas Rx Program Fund to the Mental Health Services Fund Account of 24 the Department of Health and Human Services-Division of Behavioral Health 25 Services, for the express purpose of funding Children's Behavioral Health 26 Services and transfer the remaining fund balance to the University of 27 Arkansas Medical Center Fund. 28 29 SECTION 16. Arkansas Code § 26-57-1103, concerning the Deposit of general 30 revenues, is amended to read as follows: 26-57-1103. Deposit of general revenues. 31 32 (a) Notwithstanding Acts 2001 (1st Ex. Sess.), No. 2, § 11, beginning July 33 1, 2005, twenty-nine percent (29%) of all moneys collected from the

- 34 additional tax levied in §§ 26-57-1101 and 26-57-1102 shall be deposited in
- 35 the State Treasury as special revenue and distributed as follows:
- 36 (1) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, twenty <u>Twenty</u>-

1 five percent (25%) shall be credited to the Arkansas Rx Program Fund 2 University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund; (2) Eight and one-third percent (81/3%) shall be credited to the Breast 3 4 Cancer Control Fund; 5 (3) Eight and one-third percent (81/3%) shall be credited to the Breast 6 Cancer Research Fund; 7 (4) Eight and one-third percent (81/3%) shall be credited to the 8 Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account for the Arkansas Prostate Cancer 9 Foundation: and 10 (5) Fifty percent (50%) shall be credited to the Aging and Adult 11 Services Fund Account of the Department of Human Services Fund to be used to 12 assist the Meals-on-Wheels Program. (b) If the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services and the 13 14 Director of the Department of Finance and Administration certify that the 15 amount of fees estimated to be paid by qualified residents during a fiscal 16 year pursuant to \$ 20-76-515 and credited to the Arkansas Rx Program Fund is 17 sufficient to fully support the costs and expenses of the Arkansas Rx Program for that fiscal year, the additional tax distributed under subdivision (a)(1) 18 19 of this section shall instead be distributed for that fiscal year as follows: (1) Twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) shall be credited to the Breast 20 21 Gancer Control Fund; and 22 (2) Twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) shall be credited to the Breast 23 Cancer Research Fund. 24 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 25 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL OR TEMPORARY LAW. CERTIFIED 27 SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGISTS. A public school district that receives 28 reimbursements under the Arkansas Medicaid Program for services rendered to the public school district by certified speech-language pathologists shall 29 30 first be used for reimbursements for the payment of incentive bonuses to retain and recruit qualified, certified speech-language pathologists in the 31 32 salaries of certified speech-language pathologists employed by the public 33 school district. If necessary the Department of Health and Human Services is 34 directed to seek a waiver from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to implement this provision. 35

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1 SECTION 18. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 2 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 3 4 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 5 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 6 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 7 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 8 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 9 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

11 SECTION 19. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 12 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 13 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 14 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 15 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 16 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 17 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 18 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 20. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 20 21 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 22 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 23 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of 24 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 25 26 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the 27 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 28 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 29 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007. 30 31 32 *(s)* Joint Budget Committee 33 34 35
