Section 1396d(r)(5)7 states that EPSDT includes any treatments or measures outlined in § 1396d(a). 8 There are twenty-seven sub-parts to § 1396d(a), and we find that sub-part 9 (a)(13), in particular, when read with the other sections of the Medicaid Act 10 listed above, mandates that early intervention day treatment be provided when 11 it is prescribed by a physician. See 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(a)(13) (defining 12 medical assistance reimbursable by Medicaid as "other diagnostic, screening, preventive, and rehabilitative services, including any medical or remedial 13 services recommended by a physician...for the maximum reduction of physical 14 15 and mental disability and restoration of an individual to the best possible 16 functional level"). (1) Effective July 1, 2007, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State 27 shall transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and 28 Auditor of the State the balance in the Department of Human Services Grants Fund Account solely from monies generated by the additional tax imposed by 29

30 <u>Arkansas Code 26-57-1102 to the University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund.</u>

31 (2) Effective July 1, 2007, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall

32 <u>transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and Auditor of</u>

33 the State the sum of one million and fifty thousand dollars (\$1,050,000) from

34 the Arkansas Rx Program Fund to the Mental Health Services Fund Account of

35 <u>the Department of Health and Human Services-Division of Behavioral Health</u>

36 Services, for the express purpose of funding Children's Behavioral Health

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1	Services and transfer the remaining fund balance to the University of
2	Arkansas Medical Center Fund.

4	SECTION 17. Arkansas Code § 26-57-1103, concerning the Deposit of general
5	revenues, is amended to read as follows:
6	26-57-1103. Deposit of general revenues.
7	(a) Notwithstanding Acts 2001 (1st Ex. Sess.), No. 2, § 11, beginning July
8	l, 2005, twenty-nine percent (29%) of all moneys collected from the
9	additional tax levied in §§ 26-57-1101 and 26-57-1102 shall be deposited in
10	the State Treasury as special revenue and distributed as follows:
11	(1) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, twenty <u>Twenty</u> -
12	five percent (25%) shall be credited to the A <del>rkansas Rx Program Fund</del>
13	University of Arkansas Medical Center Fund;
14	(2) Eight and one-third percent (81/3%) shall be credited to the Breast
15	Cancer Control Fund;
16	(3) Eight and one-third percent (81/3%) shall be credited to the Breast
17	Cancer Research Fund;
18	(4) Eight and one-third percent (81/3%) shall be credited to the
19	Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account for the Arkansas Prostate Cancer
20	Foundation; and
21	(5) Fifty percent (50%) shall be credited to the Aging and Adult
22	Services Fund Account of the Department of Human Services Fund to be used to
23	assist the Meals-on-Wheels Program.
24	(b) If the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services and the
25	Director of the Department of Finance and Administration certify that the
26	amount of fees estimated to be paid by qualified residents during a fiscal
27	year pursuant to \$ 20-76-515 and credited to the Arkansas Rx Program Fund is
28	sufficient to fully support the costs and expenses of the Arkansas Rx Program
29	for that fiscal year, the additional tax distributed under subdivision (a)(1)
30	of this section shall instead be distributed for that fiscal year as follows:
31	(1) Twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) shall be credited to the Breast
32	Cancer Control Fund; and
33	(2) Twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) shall be credited to the Breast
34	Cancer Research Fund.

36	SECTION 18. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized

1 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 2 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 3 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 6 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 7 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

10 SECTION 19. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 11 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 12 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 13 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 14 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 15 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 16 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 17 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

19 SECTION 20. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 21 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of 22 23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 24 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the 25 26 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 27 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 28 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 29 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007. 30 31 */s/ Joint Budget Committee* 32 33 34 35
