4	districts with declining enrollment, is amended to read as follows:
5	(3)(A) During the 2006-2007, school year, a \underline{A} school district
6	with an that has experienced a decline in average daily membership over the
7	two (2) immediately preceding school years that is less than the school
8	district's previous year's average daily membership shall receive:
9	(i) Declining enrollment funding equal to the
10	difference between the average of the two (2) immediately preceding years'
11	average daily memberships and the average daily membership for the previous
12	school year multiplied by five thousand six hundred twenty dollars (\$5,620)
13	the amount of foundation funding set forth in subdivision (a)(2) of this
14	section; or
15	(ii) Special needs isolated funding under § 6-20-

17	(B) Any funding appropriated and available for declining
18	enrollment funding under subdivision (a)(3)(A)(i) of this section or special

30	student growth funding, and special education-catastrophic occurrences
31	funding, is amended to read as follows:
32	(c) Isolated funding under § 6-20-601, student growth funding, and
33	special education-catastrophic occurrences funding shall be funded as
34	follows:
35	(1) Isolated funding and special education-catastrophic
36	occurrences funding shall be allocated and funded to school districts in a

1	line item appropriation within the Public School Fund pursuant to law or
2	rules promulgated by the State Board of Education.; and
3	(2)(A) Student growth funding is calculated as the sum of the
4	following amounts:
5	(i) One quarter (1/4) of the per student foundation
6	funding for the school district under § 6-20-2305(a)(2) multiplied by the
7	increase, if any, of each of the following:
8	(a) The school district's quarterly average
9	daily membership for the first quarter of the current school year over
10	average daily membership of the previous school year;
11	(b) The school district's quarterly average
12	daily membership for the second quarter of the current year over the average
13	daily membership of the previous school year;
14	(c) The school district's quarterly average
15	daily membership for the third quarter of the current school year over the
16	average daily membership of the previous school year; and
17	(d) The school district's quarterly average
18	daily membership for the fourth quarter of the current school year over the
19	average daily membership of the previous school year; and
20	(ii) excluding Excluding any increase resulting
21	solely from consolidation or annexation with another school district.
22	(B)(i) The State Board of Education shall establish by
23	rule the timing of distributions of student growth funding and the mechanism
24	for determining the quarterly average daily membership to be used in
25	calculating student growth funding under this subsection (c).
26	(ii)(a) As the fourth quarter average daily membership
27	count will not be available until the following school fiscal year, the final
28	distribution for each school year shall include one half (1/2) of the per
29	student foundation funding for the school district under § 6-20-2305(a)(2)
30	multiplied by the increase, if any, of the school district's quarterly
31	average daily membership for the third quarter of the current school year
32	over the average daily membership of the previous school year.
33	(b) As a result of calculating the
34	distribution in subdivision $(c)(2)(B)(ii)(a)$ of this section, either an
35	adjustment shall be made in the initial distribution of growth funding for
36	the district in the following school year to be based on the actual fourth

1	quarter growth determined in subdivision $(c)(2)(A)(i)(d)$ or the school
2	district shall refund the overpayment in growth funding.
