30	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
31	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that municipalities exercising	
32	certain powers should be subject to only the procedures set forth in the	
33	subchapter under which the municipality is operating; that if the law is	not
34	amended, municipalities will be subject to other laws, specifically the d	
35	to pay attorney's fees found in other sections of the Arkansas code; and	
36	this act is necessary because effective municipalities are critical to th	

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Ţ	public health, welfare, and safety of the state and its citizens and the duty
2	to pay attorney's fees would adversely affect the exercise of their power.
3	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately
4	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
5	become effective on:
6	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
7	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
8	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
9	bill; or
10	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
11	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
