23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

 30 School Computer Network for the 2007-2009 biennium, the following maximum
 31 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the
 32 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code
 33 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.
 34 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual
 35 salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of
 36 said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying

1 positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the
 2 Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101),

 16 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 18 DISBURSEMENT PROCEDURES. The State Board of Education shall develop rules and
 19 regulations for disbursement of the funds in a manner that insures equity in
 20 meeting the provisions of the nurse to student ratio established in Arkansas
 21 Code 6-18-706.

22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
 23 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

 25 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
 27 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1
 28 of this Act may be fully funded. Any funding for that appropriation that is
 29 not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for Special Needs
 30 Isolated Funding in Section 7 1 of this Act and shall be used there for fully
 31 funding each subsection (c) through (f) of A.C.A. §6-20-604 Act 1452
 32 continuing sequentially by subsection until the available funds are
 33 exhausted.

1 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO
 3 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School
 4 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a
 5 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state
 6 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district
 7 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is
 8 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir
 9 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend
 10 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to
 11 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or
 12 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school
 13 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the
 14 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act
 15 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating
 16 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. Such
 17 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department
 18 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation
 19 as is deemed necessary.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
 21 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

22

23 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
 25 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special
 26 Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide
 27 extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such
 28 services, to provide special education services to foster children who are
 29 wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of
 30 special education supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute
 31 such funds in the manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
 33 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

35 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each
2 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time
3 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
4 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the
5 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation
6 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State
7 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-
8 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount
9 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public
10 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or
11 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public
12 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement".
13

14 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
16 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
17 Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
18 established by the State Board of Education.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
20 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.
21

22 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
24 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for
25 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with
26 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
28 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.
29

30 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
32 AUTHORITY. The Director of the Department of Education, with the approval of
33 the Chief Fiscal Officer and after approval by the Arkansas Legislative
34 Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to request necessary
35 appropriation transfers and any other budget related adjustments necessary.
36 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of

1 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
 2 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
 3 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
 4 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
 5 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
 6 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently
 7 if some flexibility is provided to the Director of the Department of
 8 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision
 9 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General
 10 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
 11 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The
 12 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
 13 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by
 14 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional
 15 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~

 19 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

 21 ASSESSMENT/END-OF-~~LEVEL~~ COURSE TESTING. Of the total amount appropriated for
 22 Assessment/End-of-~~Level~~-Course Testing for each fiscal year of the ~~2005-2007~~
 23 2007-2009 biennium, up to \$500,000 may be authorized by the Director of the
 24 Department of Education to be used to provide staff development training for
 25 educational cooperatives, school districts, and for Department of Education
 26 staff on such content areas as test interpretation, goal setting, educational
 27 plan development, curriculum development, instructional strategies, classroom
 28 management and for evaluation procedures.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
 30 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

31
 32 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN
 34 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds
 35 authorized herein to the Department of Education - for the Quiz Bowl each
 36 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed ~~40%~~ forty thousand dollars (\$40,000)

1 each fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -
 2 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the
 3 Quiz Bowl.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
 5 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

6
 7 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

9 INTERVENTION BLOCK GRANTS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Department of Education
 10 shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation
 11 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal
 12 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred
 13 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Odyssey of the Mind for grants up to
 14 \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five hundred
 15 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Destination Imagination, and five
 16 thousand dollars (\$5,000) each fiscal year for the State History Day
 17 Competition. The Department of Education shall allocate General Revenue
 18 funding totaling no less than one hundred thirty two thousand dollars
 19 (\$132,000) each fiscal year from the Department of Education Public School
 20 Fund Account to support the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, the Odyssey of
 21 the Mind for grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones,
 22 Destination Imagination, and the State History Day Competition. The
 23 Department shall either expend or have committed for expenditure the monies
 24 allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Odyssey of the Mind, Destination Imagination,
 25 and the State History Day Competition as authorized herein in order to
 26 fulfill the provisions of this section.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
 28 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

29
 30 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EAST
 32 FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total amount appropriated for Technology Grants
 33 each fiscal year, an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000)
 34 or eighteen percent (18%), whichever is greater each fiscal year, shall be
 35 awarded through a grant or professional services contract for EAST
 36 infrastructure, ~~personal services~~ personnel, and operating expenses. The EAST

1 infrastructure grant or contract for personal services and operating expenses
2 shall be awarded to an entity that has personnel or experience, or both, in
3 implementing the EAST Initiative.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
5 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

6

9 NET FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total appropriation authorized by this Act for
10 Technology Grants the Department of Education shall make available one
11 hundred eighty seven thousand five hundred seventy five dollars (\$187,575)
12 each fiscal year for Explor-Net Program initiatives to teach students
13 computer repair in a hands-on environment. The Department of Education shall
14 allocate General Revenue funding totaling no less than one hundred eighty

28 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to,
29 teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by
30 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based
31 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving

26 school setting and, if the internet or long-distance learning technology is
27 used, the internet or long-distance learning technology is used as a
28 supplement to the school's traditional classroom setting.

34 TEACHER SALARY. The Arkansas Department of Education is requested to
35 calculate Average Teacher Salary in the Department's Annual Statistical
36 Report to not include extra duty funds. Specifically, the Department is

1 requested to calculate the Average Teacher Salary amount using the National
2 Education Association definitions for Average Salary for Classroom Teachers.
3 The Arkansas Department of Education shall report on the feasibility of this
4 action to the House and Senate Committees on Education by February 1, 2007.
5

6 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
8 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for the Arkansas Better
9 Chance for School Success Program remaining on June 30, 2008 and June 30,
10 2009, in the Department of Education Public School Fund Account shall be
11 designated and retained for the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success
12 Program.

13 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of appropriation and/or funding as
14 authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

11 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
12 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
13 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
14 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
15 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
16 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
17 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
18 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

19
20 SECTION 29. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
21 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
22 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
23 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
24 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
25 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
26 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
27 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

28
29 SECTION 30. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
30 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
31 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
32 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
33 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
34 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
35 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
36 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.

1 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
2 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
3 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.

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
