The Department of Education shall distribute the 13 14 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act 15 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating 16 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. Such 17 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 18 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 19 as is deemed necessary. 20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 21 2007 through June 30, 2007 2009. 22 SECTION 9.
