The Director of the Department of Education, with the approval of 7 the Chief Fiscal Officer and after approval by the Arkansas Legislative 8 Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to request necessary 9 appropriation transfers and any other budget related adjustments necessary. 10 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 11 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 12 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 13 14 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 15 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law.
