1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SALARY OF 2 THE DIRECTOR COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the appropriation for the salary of the Director 3 4 Commissioner of the Department of Education shall be the sole and exclusive 5 authority for his or her salary. (a) To address needs emerging from 23 24 statewide education issues and the necessity of recruiting and retaining 25 qualified personnel, the Arkansas Department of Education or its successor 26 agency is authorized for the 2005-2007 2007-2009 biennium a pool of twenty 27 five (25) non-classified positions at a maximum salary level not to exceed 28 one hundred twenty five thousand dollars (\$125,000) per year. - 24 Any salary adjustments administered under the provisions of this Section
- 25 shall be determined by comparing the qualifications and salary levels of
- 26 similar employees in school districts or in other state education agencies.
- 27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 2007
- 28 through June 30, 2007 2009.

- 30 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS
- 32 LEADERSHIP ACADEMY REDUCTION OF FUNDS RESTRICTION. Upon determination by
- 33 the Department of Education that a reduction in the amount of available

- 35 from the amount appropriated, the reduction in the available appropriation

7	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TEACHER
8	HOUSING DEVELOPMENT FUNDING. The appropriation for Teacher Housing
9	Development provided in Act 229 of 2007 shall be fully funded and reduced
10	only proportionally for decreases in the Official General Revenue Forecast.
11	
12	SECTION 38. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
13	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OPEN-
14	ENROLLMENT VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS. The Special Language
15	Section regarding "Charter School Funding Restrictions" in Section 24 of Act
16	229 of 2007 is amended to read as follows:
17	
18	SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE
19	ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY
20	LAW. CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS. OPEN-ENROLLMENT VIRTUAL
21	CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS. Regardless of any provision of
22	any law to the contrary, the Department of Education shall fund from
23	state monies only those charter schools which provide education
24	services in a traditional public school setting and, if the internet or
25	long distance learning technology is used, the internet or long-
26	distance learning technology is used as a supplement to the school's
27	traditional classroom setting.
28	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July
29	1, 2005 <u>2007</u> through June 30, 2007 <u>2009</u> .
30	(a) Regardless of any provision of law to the contrary, beginning
31	with the 2007-2008 school year, no school district shall receive state
32	funding for those students in the district's prior year three quarter
33	average daily membership who were enrolled and attending a public
34	school with an internet, long-distance or virtual technology curriculum
35	based program which was not part of a public school district and the
36	public school program was funded by a federal voluntary public school

1	choice grant administered by the Department of Education.
2	(b) Prior to July 1, 2007, the Department of Education shall
3	notify the Arkansas State Board of Education of the maximum number of
4	students that the State Board of Education shall allow to enroll and
5	attend any open-enrollment charter school that uses internet, long-
6	distance or virtual technology as the primary method of teaching. It
7	is the intent of this language that the Department shall not establish
8	and certify a number of students to the State Board of Education that
9	exceeds the number of students for which school districts were not able
10	to receive state funding because of the requirements of paragraph (a).
11	However, to the extent there are any revenue savings caused by the
12	closure of any open-enrollment charter school in existence on July 1,
13	2006, the State Board of Education may increase the maximum number of
14	students allowed to enroll and attend an internet, long-distance or
15	virtual technology open-enrollment charter school to the extent the
16	maximum number of students does not exceed five hundred (500) students.
17	(c) The provisions of this special language shall not restrict,
18	affect or impair any other provision of law or rule concerning public
19	school districts or public charter schools except as provided in
20	paragraph (a) and (b).
21	(d) The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from
22	July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2009.
23	
24	
25	SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
26	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. <u>FUND</u>
27	TRANSFER - "END TO END" SECURITY REVIEW/ASSESSMENT. Immediately upon the
28	effective date of this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall
29	transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer and the Auditor of
30	State, the sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) from the General
31	Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the Department of Education Public School
32	Fund Account. The amount transferred shall be used to provide funds for the
33	supplemental appropriation for the Arkansas Public School Computer Network —
34	"End to End" Security Review and Security Assessment provided in this Act.
35	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007
36	through June 30, 2009.

1	
2	SECTION 40. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
3	by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
4	made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
5	restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
6	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
7	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
8	control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
9	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
10	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.
11	
12	SECTION 41. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
13	that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
14	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
15	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
16	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
17	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
18	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
19	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
20	
21	SECTION 42. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
22	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
23	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
24	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
25	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
26	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
27	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
28	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
29	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
30	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
31	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
