18	from the selection of certain textbooks and course materials; that in order		
19	to provide the best state-supported higher education possible, the best		
20	available textbooks and course materials should be objectively selected		
21	without regard to any personal financial gain; and that the passage of this		
22	act is immediately necessary to help students receive the best available		
23	textbooks and course materials needed for a quality education. Therefore, an		
24	emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for		
25	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become		
26	effective on:		
27	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
28	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
29	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
30	bill; or		
31	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
32	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
