2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the			
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that textbooks and course materials			
4	for state-supported institution of higher education students are often			
5	purchased at higher prices than necessary or not at all due to a lack of			
6	competitive advertising; that students sometimes do not purchase needed			
7	textbooks and course materials due to a lack of funds; and that the passage			
8	of this act is immediately necessary to enable students to obtain the			
9	textbooks and course materials needed to help ensure a quality education at a			
10	more affordable price. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this			
11	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,			
12	health, and safety shall become effective on:			
13	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
14	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
15	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
16	bill; or			
17	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
18	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
