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2	SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
3	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
4	Uncodified Section 4 of Act 755 of 2003, concerning the Arkansas Commission
5	on Eye and Vision Care of School Age Children is amended as follows:
6	
7	SECTION 4. Funding.
8	(a)(1) The commission's funding shall be from grants, donations, and
9	any other funds that may be made available through appropriations by the
10	General Assembly.
11	<u>(2) Moneys received by the commission shall be used solely for the</u>
12	support of the functions of the commission.
13	(b)(1) Grants and donations received by the commission shall be
14	cash funds and shall be administered by the Arkansas Department of
15	Health but shall be subject to appropriation by the General Assembly.
16	(2) Any moneys received from grantors and donors that are not
17	expended by the commission shall be returned to the grantors and donors
18	in proportion that each bears to the total of all grants and donations
19	received by the commission.
20	

SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 21 22 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 23 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 24 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 25 26 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 27 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 28 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 29 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

31 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 32 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 33 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 34 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 35 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 36 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral

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1	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
2	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
3	
4	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
5	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
6	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
7	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
8	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
9	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
10	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
11	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
12	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
13	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
14	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
