22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23

24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2007-2009 biennium,
26 the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be
27 governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act
28 (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory
29 thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum
30 annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the
31 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons
32 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions
33 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-
34 101), or its successor.

SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ADMISSION POLICY. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall admit one hundred fifty (150) freshman students in each year of the ~~2005-2007~~ 2007-2009 biennium into the College of Medicine. Provided that no funds shall be expended to fund the positions of Chancellor, Dean of Medicine and any academic position until the Chancellor and Dean of Medicine certify to the Arkansas Legislative Council that the provision of this Section relating to the ~~2005-2007~~ 2007-2009 biennium requirement for one hundred fifty (150) freshman student admissions has been implemented.

The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences may designate up to forty-five per cent (45%) of the regular gross salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or

13 Furthermore, the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) of the Division of

15 establish and maintain for the ~~2005-2007~~ 2007-2009 biennium a pool of three
16 hundred (300) classified positions at up to a grade 26. These positions are
17 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event
18 that the personal services needs of the University during the ~~2005-2007~~ 2007-
19 2009 biennium exceed the number of positions in a classification allocated to
20 the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification
21 to OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No
22 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
23 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved
24 by the Legislative Council.

25 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is
26 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
27 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and
28 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly
29 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
30 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
31 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in
32 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the
33 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary
34 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the
35 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
36 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of

1 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section.
2 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled
3 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is

17 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family
18 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of
19 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and
20 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically
21 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health
22 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not
23 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and
24 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas
25 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-
26 Department of Pediatrics shall make annual reports to the Arkansas
27 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services
28 offered through CHFLI.

27 SECTION 33. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
29 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
30 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
31 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
32 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
33 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
34 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
